### 1. Summary

1.1 19 Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act (RIPA) authorisations have been made for the year 2011 (January to December 2011) and are detailed on Appendix A attached, some of which have already been reported to this Committee.

#### 2. Purpose of report

2.1 To update Members on the Authority's use of Regulatory Powers, in accordance with Policy, for the period for the year 2011 from January to December 2011.

#### 3. Background

- 3.1 Surveillance by a public authority may constitute an infringement of an individual's rights and freedoms which are protected by the Human Rights Act 1998. However, by following the authorisation procedures set out by the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act, officers of the Council are ensuring that they can demonstrate that the surveillance is necessary for a purpose permitted by the Human Rights Act and that it is a proportionate measure to take, given all of the circumstances.
- 3.2 Compliance with the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act (RIPA) will significantly reduce the chances of any surveillance carried out by the Council being unlawful and therefore subject to legal challenge. PCC has a Policy and procedures to ensure that officers comply with the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act requirements to mitigate any legal challenge risks.
- 3.3 The Office of Surveillance Commissioners issues guidance to relevant bodies on the use of RIPA and have recently issued (December 2011) an update.

#### 4. Recommendations

It is recommended that Members of the Governance and Audit Committee:

- 4.1 Note the RIPA applications authorised for 2011 from January to December 2011,
- 4.2 Approve the change in reporting to Members annually.

### 5. Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act Authorisations

- 5.1 19 RIPA applications have been authorised for the year 2011 (January to December 2011) these include:
  - 8 x testing of underage tobacco sales/illegal tobacco sales/ illegal sale of alcohol resulting in two potential prosecutions, 1 licensee training, 1 warning, and 2 surrendered licences
  - 3 x sales of counterfeit goods resulting in 1 no offence being detected and 2 prosecutions pending
  - 7 x blue badge frauds resulting in 3 prosecutions, 2 prosecutions pending and 2 minor offences so warnings were given.
  - 1 x -cold calling of rogue traders resulting in 3 warnings given
- 5.2 Where a prosecution doesn't arise it can be because a warning has been issued to a first offender to deter any re-offending or because the intelligence that an officer has at the time of the authorisation turns out to be unfounded. On these occasions it has been determined that a RIPA authorisation for covert surveillance is the only way to test the intelligence.
- 5.3 RIPA numbers for this year (January to December 2011) total 19 compared to 11 for the same period last year. This is due to the increased activity on Blue Badge fraud and testing of illegal sales. Portsmouth City Council currently carries out RIPA authorisations for Trading Standards test purchases. In 2010 there were:
  - 6 x misuse of Blue Badge authorisations leading to 3 prosecutions
  - 4 x authorisations for counterfeit clothing sales leading to 2 prosecutions pending
  - 1 x for breaching licensing conditions where no offence was detected.

# **OSC Guidance**

5.4 The recent updated guidance issued by the Office of Surveillance Commissioners (OSC) mainly focuses on Intrusive surveillance; which local authorities are not allowed to conduct, CHIS (covert human intelligence source) which where appropriate we have covered in our Policy and drive bys and test purchases, both of which we covered in our last update report to members for inclusion in our Policy.

# Training

- 5.5 Services that are likely to carry out activities under RIPA authorisations (including those authorised by other bodies such as the Police) include:
  - Anti-Social Behaviour Order Unit
  - Health and Social care
  - Close Circuit Television (CCTV)
  - Revenues and Benefits
  - Trading Standards
  - Any other enforcement activity
- 5.6 As reported at the last meeting of G&A awareness training was rolled out in April 2010 and further updated training given to some of these officers on 23<sup>RD</sup> August 2011. Further training is planned for 20<sup>th</sup> March 2012.

# Reporting

5.7 Currently the RIPA Policy requires regular reports on RIPA activity to be brought to this Committee and this has usually been at least three times a year. As the numbers of RIPA applications are relatively low this has led to reports giving similar information on each occasion. To enable Members to review the RIPA activity in its entirety for the year and hopefully make it more meaningful it is proposed to report annually to members. If activity increases or other matters arise (such as an inspection by the Office of Surveillance Commissioners) then further reports will be brought to Members at that time.

### 6. Equality impact assessment (EIA)
