1. Apologies for Absence

No apologies were sent.

2. Declaration of Members' Interests

No interests were declared.

3. Government Consultation - Prevent Duty Guidance

Rachael Dalby, Head of Health, Safety and Licensing introduced the report and in response to questions, clarified the following points:

- The probation service is the responsible authority for community safety purposes. The Clinical Commissioning Group is responsible for health. Education is not a responsible authority but the local authority is.
- The proposed legislation is quite nuanced.
- A similar paper will be considered by the Safer Portsmouth Partnership on 29 January.
- Five years ago, the duty regarding prevent was included in the annual Strategic Assessment and it was a priority for the council.
- Details of how the council would comply with this will be drawn up after the consultation.
- The university is a key player as it deals with potentially vulnerable people.
- It was agreed that the Cabinet Member would write to the Home Office with his views.

DECISION

The Cabinet Member for Environment & Community Safety approved the recommended responses in section 6 of the report.

4. Domestic abuse review - distance travelled.

Rachael Dalby, Head of Health, Safety & Licensing introduced the report.

5. Waste regulations - assessment of compliance.

Paul Fielding, Assistant Head of Service for Environment & Recreation, Transport and Environment introduced the report.
