The purpose of the report by the Head of Transport and Environment is to consider the public consultation responses to making the closure point in Villiers Road a permanent feature, following its installation under an Experimental Order. When objections are received to Traffic Regulation

Orders, it is a statutory requirement to consider them and for decisions to be made at a formal decision meeting.

RECOMMENDED that instead of continuing with the road closure on a permanent basis, Villiers Road is opened to one-way traffic in a westbound direction between The Vale and the current closure point.

Members of the public are now permitted to use both audio visual recording devices and social media during this meeting, on the understanding that it neither disrupts the meeting or records those stating explicitly that they do not wish to be recorded.
