Licensing Act 2003 – Application for variation of a premises licence at the Fat Fox and Atrium Bar, Victoria Road South, Southsea. PO5 2SP

### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is for the Committee to consider an application for the variation of a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act"). The matter has been referred to the Committee for determination following formal representations being made by "other persons" namely residents living nearby concerned over additional noise the extension to hours would create together with an increase in disorderly behaviour in the area in general.

#### 2. THE APPLICATION

The variation application has been made by James Jarman the co-owner of Fat Fox and Atrium who is also the designated premises supervisor (DPS) for the premises situated in Victoria Road South.

The applicant has requested that the licence be varied in respect of the above premises so as to extend all current licensable activities by one hour on a Friday and Saturday night until 01:30. Full details below and on application at **appendix A** 

- To vary the timings of Films Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:59 as per existing Licence and from 12:00 until 01:30 Friday and Saturday.
- To vary live music from Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:59 as per existing licence and from 12:00 to 01:30 Friday and Saturday.
- To vary the timings of performances of dance Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:59 as per existing licence and from 12:00 until 01:30 Friday and Saturday.
- Recorded music as per existing licence.
- To vary performance of dance Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:59 as per existing licence and from 12:00 until 01:30 Friday and Saturday.
- To vary the Late Night Refreshment provision Sunday to Thursday from 23:00 to 00:30 and on Friday and Saturday from 23:00 until 01:30
- To extend the supply of alcohol sales on Sunday 10:00 to 23:30 and Monday to Thursday 10:00 to 00:30 as per existing licence and on Friday and Saturday 10:00 until 01:30. New year and Bank Holiday times as per application Friday or Saturday 10:00 to 02:00 Sunday 10:00 until 00:30 Christmas Eve 10:00 until 01:00 and New Year's Eve 10:00 until 03:00
- To extend the hours the premises are open to the public Sunday 10:00 until 23:59 as per existing licence. Monday to Thursday 10:00 until 01:00 and on Friday and Saturday 10:00 until 02:00. On Bank Holidays Sunday 10:00 to 01:30. Friday and Saturday 10:00 to 02:30. Christmas Eve 10:00 to 02:00. New Year's eve 10:00 to 04:00

The current premises licence is attached at appendix B

Six local residents and a Ward Councillor have made representations which are attached at **appendix C** 

#### 3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This application has been submitted in accordance with the provisions of Part 3 of the Act and associated Regulations. I can confirm that public notice has been given by way of press notice, premises notice and local councillors have also been notified. There are no grounds therefore for the committee to reject the application for non-compliance with the advertising requirements prescribed by the act and regulations.

The premises are in two parts. The ground floor is the Fat Fox and this is in two halves with the main bar located on the south side of the building with limited seating in this area. The other half of the venue consists mainly of seating and tables and also a stage area. The Atrium is on the first floor with its own entrance door on the south side of the building. Access is via a winding staircase that leads into a small seating area plus a bar. The Atrium specialises in cocktails and caters for up to 70 people mainly 18 to 30 year olds. The ground floor area can hold over 200 patrons whose average ages are between 25 and 50. There have been 10 occasions since January 2015 where TENs have been granted extending hours on three days until 05:00 in the morning.

The immediate area is dominated by shops and other licensed venues / restaurants etc. To assist with this application attached at **appendix D** are the opening times of venues close to the Fat Fox.

### 4. OPERATING SCHEDULE - PROMOTION OF LICENSING OBJECTIVES

The applicant has detailed in the operating schedule the steps intended to be taken (and as appropriate to promote the licensing objectives) in support of this variation application. Currently the venue does not have a condition requiring SIA door supervisors to work at the venue but the management at the venue do secure door staff to work on Friday and Saturdays. Both owners are personal licence holders securing their licences in 2006 and 2007 respectively.

In consultation with the police, conditions have been agreed with the applicant and these will be added to the premises licence as part of this application process. Some old conditions will be removed and these are attached at **appendix E** 

#### 5. RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS BY RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES

There are no representations submitted by any of the statutory responsible authorities. Environmental Health do have two current noise complaints open at this time from two separate complainants but have not visited these complainants to establish whether a statutory nuisance is occurring.

### 6. RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS BY OTHER PERSONS

Relevant representations has been received from six local residents concerned with general issues in the area which can be summarised as follows:

- Increased noise over longer period of time
- Anti-social behaviour with footfall at the venue increasing over a longer period.
- Potential for other venues to increase their trading hours if this application is successful.

Ward Councillor for Saint Jude Hugh Mason has submitted a representation raising concerns regarding bars in Albert Road in general. He has indicated that an extension to Fat Fox's licensing hours should be no later than those of equivalent bars in that part of Albert Road with a closure time of no later than 01:00 on Fridays and Saturdays be approved by the Licensing Sub-Committee.

#### Officer note:

Please be advised that one of the representations reports police attending Fat Fox to deal with a large disturbance. This is not correct. Two customers were behaving inappropriately towards females in the venue, prior to being asked to leave. The management requested additional door support as a precautionary measure. This resulted in a number of SIA door stewards leaving venues in close proximity to support the door staff at Fat Fox. The individuals left the venue without incident.

### 7. POLICY AND STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS

When determining the application to vary the premises licence the Committee must have regard to:

- Promotion of the licensing objectives which are;
- prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- prevention of public nuisance
- protection of children from harm
- ➤ The Licensing Act 2003;
- > Judgements of the High Court, (your legal adviser will give you guidance should this become necessary).
- Its Statement of Licensing Policy;
- ➤ The statutory guidance issued by the Home Secretary in accordance with section 182 of the Act; and
- > The representations, including supporting information, presented by all the parties.

### **Statement of Licensing Policy**

The Statement of Licensing Policy lays down a general approach to the determination of licensing applications and any such application will be considered on its individual merits. Equally, any person permitted by the Act to make relevant representations to the Committee pillips those representations considered on

their individual merit.

The committee should consider the fundamental principles set out in its policy, particularly paragraphs 4.6 and 4.7 which are reproduced below:

- 4.6 Whether or not incidents can be regarded as being "in the vicinity" of licensed premises is a question of fact and will depend on the particular circumstances of the case. In cases of dispute, the question will ultimately be decided by the courts. In addressing this matter, the Licensing Authority will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at the licensed premises on members of the public living, working or engaged in normal activity in the area concerned.
- 4.7 Licensing law is not the primary mechanism for the general control of nuisance and anti-social behaviour by individuals once they are away from the licensed premises and, therefore, beyond the direct control of the individual, club or business holding the licence, certificate or authorisation concerned. Nonetheless, it is a key aspect of such control and licensing law will always be part of the overall approach to the management of the evening and night-time economy in town and city centres.

The committee should also have regard to paragraphs 7.1 to 7.6 in relation to such circumstances where it may be appropriate to consider the imposition of conditions on a premises licence.

### **Statutory Guidance**

The updated statutory guidance issued by the Home Secretary in accordance with section 182 of the Act, which came into force in March 2015, refers to the consideration of applications for the grant or variation of premises licences in Chapter 9.

Members may wish to consider the following extracts from the statutory guidance when determining this application:

### Para 9.36

".... As a matter of practice, licensing authorities should seek to focus the hearing on the steps needed to promote the particular licensing objective which has given rise to the specific representation and avoid straying into undisputed areas. A responsible authority or other persons may choose to rely on their written representations. They may not add further representations to those disclosed to the applicant prior to the hearing, but they may expand on their existing representation..."

### Para 9.41

"Licensing authorities are best placed to determine what actions are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in their areas. All licensing determinations should be considered on a case-by-case basis. They should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representation made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be".

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#### Para 9.42

"The authority's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve"

#### Para 9.43

"Determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. While this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises licence holder (such as the financial burden due to restrictions on licensable activities) as well as the potential benefit in terms of the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it is imperative that the authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the objectives and nothing outside those parameters.

As with the consideration of licence variations, the licensing authority should consider wider issues such as other conditions already in place to mitigate potential negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives and the track record of the business.

Further advice on determining what is appropriate when imposing conditions on a licence or certificate is provided in Chapter 10. The licensing authority is expected to come to its determination based on an assessment of the evidence on both the risks and benefits either for or against making the determination."

### Para 10.14 (Hours of Trading)

"Where there are objections to an application to extend the hours during which licensable activities are to be carried on and the licensing authority determines that this would undermine the licensing objectives, it may reject the application or grant it with appropriate conditions and/or different hours from those requested".

Members may also wish to consider Chapter 11 of the statutory guidance in respect of reviews of premises licences. Paragraphs 11.1 and 11.2 of the guidance states:

#### Para 11.1

"The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for reviewing premises licences and club premises certificates represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives occur after the grant or variation of a premises licence or club premises certificate".

#### Para 11.2

At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence or club premises certificate, a responsible authority, or other person, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence or certificate because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.

### **Appeal Provisions**

Schedule 5, part 1, of the Act sets out the appeal provisions in relation to the determination of an application to vary a premises licence.

Where the Licensing Authority rejects (in whole or in part) an application, the applicant may appeal against the decision to the Magistrates' Court.

Should the committee grant (in whole or in part) an application, the applicant may appeal against any decision to modify the conditions of the licence.

Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application contends that:

- a) that any variation made ought not to have been made, or
- b) that, on varying the licence, the Licensing Authority ought not to have modified the conditions of the licence, or ought to have modified them in a different way, under section 4(a) of that section,

He may appeal against the decision.

I writing to object to the proposed extension of licensing hours at the Fat Fox on Albert Road, Southsea. My comments are as follows:

- 1. It will lead to an increase in disorderly behaviour in the Albert Road, as people will be able to drink more over the course of an evening and so are likely to be more intoxicated when they leave the pub.
- 2. It will lead to more disturbance for residents as it will spread the noise of people leaving the pub over more hours, and it will also lead to people living near the pub being disturbed later at night than they already are.
- 3. The later opening hours will lead to greater footfall in the pub, which will also add to disturbance for the residents.



# **Dear Officers and Councillors**

Reference The FAT FOX/Atrium 11 -13 Victoria Road Southsea PO5 5HH.

Referene No. NONE on the flyers

Intouch with Southsea informed some residents of the pending application for extended opening times at the FAT FOX to 1.30 am Fridays and Saturdays in the future.

My husband and I are residents in Albert Road we live alongside the FAT FOX.

We are objecting to the proposed extension to hours of business at the above mentioned public house on the grounds of noise nuisance and public health implications.

Firstly – the constant noise from idling engines/slamming of taxi doors whilst picking up noisy customers is irritating beyond midnight at the best of times. The cars and taxi's often park on the bend of the traffic island and extend on to the double yellow lines in front of our property thus blocking other traffic turning into Albert Road which creates deadlock and even more noise.

Secondly – there is no policy for smokers standing out side the pub during the drinking sessions as it is, noise is not kept under control during the current hours of opening. Litter by way of disgarded cigarette ends/ bottles and chewing gum end up in to doorway or are left in front of our blind.

Thirdly - the bands that are often playing there create an enormous amount of noise when loading their vehicles after a gig late at night.

The last instance is that of human detritus spewed out onto pavements – the publicans seem oblivious to clearing this mess up even outside their own businesses. It can be left for days and only when it rains is it cleared away???

The implications of extending their hours of business comes at a time when we have only just resolved the excessive noise from the V and A pub who are now very accommodating to the residents, in that they have curbed their late night openings and noise nuisance over the weekends by agreeing to keep drinking hours to a reasonable time.

**OUR QUESTIONS ARE -**

Who will police the venue as policing is non existent from 12 midnight? Likewise – Vespaisian Security end their shift at midnight so what happens beyond this time?

In our minds there is a distinct possibility they will be serving people late at night who are already fuelled with more then enough alcohol - who will police this? Who will pick up the bills for drunks who may need NHS treatment

Portsmouth already has an alcohol problem, do we want more problems for the police and our overstretched Health service?

People, often friends, who are fuelled with alcohol raise their voices in anger toward each other using horrendous expletives at high volume whilst standing outside our property, often violence breaks out and glass is scattered across the pavements and the road. As it is we cannot retire at night before 12.30 am at the weekend due to the noise from people and cars.

The extended time scale will cause havoc and unwanted sleepless nights, it is totally unacceptable – sleep deprivation creates illness and can kill.

We personally need sleep as we need to be up at 6am on Sunday mornings for business reasons. The thought of having to drive away on business after two sleepless nights is already frightening and something the highway authorities discourage. 'Tiredness can kill'.

Public health and safety must be paramount over late night drinking and partying. There are numerous outlets in the city away from residential areas where late night drinking can be found.

A recent example of the lack of monitoring alcohol fuelled people has just happened with ICE BREAKER in Albert Road 30<sup>TH</sup> January, it turned out to be the noisiest night of the winter to date. The police we called to THE FAT FOX as fighting broke out on a grand scale and could only be dealt with, with police presence. "THE LOFT" a venue approximately 100 yards away on the same block and connected to ICE BREAKER – had what was described as a Glassing incident – fighting with broken beer bottles and wine glasses. Police also called out.

If THE FAT FOX clearly cannot control or take responsibility for a ONE OFF EVENT how are we expected to believe they can control two evenings every weekend in the foreseeable future.

It beggars belief that residents nearby like ourselves could possibly be subjected to this noise nuisance and alcohol fuelled violence all over again.

It is not as though Portsmouth and Southsea are short of late night drinking venues.

We are asking for your support to turn this application down.

Good afternoon,

Representation is hereby submitted against the proposed variation to the existing license held by 'The Fat Fox' public house, <u>11-13 Victoria Road South</u>, Southsea, PO52SP. This variation, if approved, would permit the sale of alcohol in the aforementioned establishment from 1000 until 0130 every Friday and Saturday. Pursuant to the specified licensing

objectives, representation is made on the grounds of prevention of a public nuisance for the following reasons:

- a. Antisocial behaviour. There are already regular instances of shouting and other on-street disruptions of sometimes severely inebriated members of the public. As the entrance to my building is next door to The Fat Fox, I also suffer from people pressing the intercom buzzer at unsocial times of the evening/early morning which is particularly disruptive as I am occasionally required to work weekends.
- b. Littering. The door to my building does not have a letterbox, but instead a post box is attached to the outside wall. This is very near to the area used by The Fat Fox as their smoking area and I have, on numerous occasions, found empty cigarette boxes posted into the post box as well as cigarette butts, which clearly poses a fire risk particularly if mail is present in the box.
- c. Noise hygiene. The level of music played is singularly the most disruptive element to this representation and has recently become more disruptive that it has in the past with the heavy bass causing excessive vibration. To increase the time allowed to play music would significantly impact the quality of life of residents in the neighbouring dwellings.

The existing license is tolerable if the issues stated above could be rectified, however the proposed variation to the license would arguably create an establishment more akin to a nightclub than a public house. 01. The licence holder shall comply with the following requirements concerning the use of CCTV at the premises.

Operation and Storage.

The CCTV system must be fully operational whilst the venue is open to the public.

The recording equipment shall be stored and operated in a secure environment with limited access, to avoid damage, theft, unauthorised viewing and maintain the integrity of the system.

A record should be kept of any access made to information held on the system.

The system shall be regularly maintained and serviced.

The system clock shall be checked regularly for accuracy taking account of GMT and BST.

Tapes should be changed daily and kept for 31 days before being re used. Tapes should be replaced after 12 usages i.e. annually.

Digital systems shall have sufficient storage capacity for 31 days good quality pictures.

The images produced will be date and time stamped.

#### Access

It is important that the Police are able to access data from the systems quickly and easily and therefore provision shall be made for someone to have access to the secure area and also be able to operate the equipment.

Ensure all operators receive training from the installer when equipment is installed and that this is cascaded down to new members of staff.

Have a simple operator's manual available to assist in replaying and exporting data (particularly important with digital systems).

At all times that the premises is open for trade a person shall be on site that is able to work the CCTV system and provide a copy of any footage to the Police or a member of the licensing authority on request.

- 02. The licence holder shall ensure that when regulated entertainment consisting of live music is performed, all windows and doors, excluding entrance and exit doors, shall be closed at 22:00.
- 03. The provision of live music is not permitted on the first floor of the premises.
- 04. Children under 18 years of age will not be permitted entry to the premises after 21:00.
- O5. Any person appearing to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 25 and who is attempting to buy alcohol will be required to produce satisfactory photographic identification as proof of age. Such identification may include Valid photo card-driving licence, Valid passport with hologram, PASS approved photo ID (Proof of Age Standards Scheme).
- 06. The permitted hours restrictions do not prohibit:
- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- b) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- c) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- d) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- e) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- f) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- g) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the

liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

07. In accordance with paragraphs 6(8) and 18 (5) of Schedule 8 of the Licensing Act 2003, the licence holder shall have regard to the statutory provisions contained within the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (as amended).

#### To be Added

- 1. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy
- 2. All staff must receive comprehensive training in relation to age restricted products and the sale of alcohol. No member of staff shall be permitted to sell age restricted products until such time as they have successfully completed this training. Training shall cover:
- Sale of alcohol to persons under 18
- Challenge 25 and acceptable forms of identification
- Signs of drunkenness
- Refusal register and when/how to use
- The Licensing Objectives

A copy of this training shall be kept on site and provided to the Police or Licensing Authority upon request.

- 3. A refusal log shall be kept and maintained at the premises in a digital or paper copy. Police shall have access to the refusal log on request.
- 4. On a Friday and Saturday a minimum of 2 Door supervisors shall be employed from 20:00 hours until 15 minutes after the closure of the premises to the public. These door supervisors shall be employed solely in a security and safety capacity.
- 5. The door supervisors, shall wear a fluorescent/ reflective brightly coloured tabard/jacket, clearly marked security.
- 6. The licence holder shall maintain a duty register giving details of each and every person employed in the role of a security and shall provide upon request by any Police Officer or Council Officer, the following details:-
- (a) The licence number, name, date of birth and residential address of that person;
- (b) The time at which he/she commenced that period of duty, with a signed acknowledgement by that person;
- (c) The time at which he/she finished the period of duty, with a signed acknowledgement by that person;
- (d) Any times during the period of duty when he/she was not on duty;
- (e) If that person is not an employee of the licence holder, the name of the person by whom that person is employed or through whom the services of that person were engaged;
- (f) The register shall be so kept that it can be readily inspected by an authorised officer of the Council or Police Officer;
- (g) The duty register shall comprise of a bound, consecutively page-numbered book and the licence holder shall ensure that this register is kept in a secure environment in order to prevent unauthorised access or alterations to same.
- 7. The premises licence holder shall provide an ejection/refusal policy which shall be kept at the premises. This Policy shall be provided to Police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.
- 8. The Premises Licence Holder shall provide a Policy stating how they will deal with Drugs at the Premises. This shall be provided to Police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority upon request.

9.	A representative shall be an active member of any local Pub Watch scheme where there is one in existence and their membership welcome.
