Further to the recent application by Victory News, located at 261 Copnor Road for a 24 hours trading licence please take this email as a formal objection to this application and request that it be rejected.

the granting of such a licence would have a major and overwhelmingly negative effect on our local community due to the potential and extremely likely increase in traffic (both foot and road) at unsocial hours creating an unacceptable level of noise and disruption to the lives of local residents with groups congregating outside the shop leading to an intimidatory and stressful atmosphere for residents in the immediate area. I also feel strongly that this application would greatly increase the level of antisocial behaviour in the area and particularly in and around nearby College Park where inevitably some people would go to consume alcohol bought at Victory News and groups would congregate I have genuine concerns that should this happen College Park would cease to be the attractive community/family space it current is and will become an area to avoid because of a significant increase of litter and fear of encountering antisocial behaviour, both of which creating an unacceptable and needless strain on council/police resources.

I really have to question the need for this licence as there are already shops in the local area that have later opening hours and the negative effect granting this application would have on local residents and the area is wholly unacceptable, unwanted and I ask you support our community and reject this application.
