# 18. Review into Progress against the Youth Offending Team Improvement Plan (Al 4)

Stephen Kitchman advised the panel that an inspection of the YOT had taken place two weeks ago by HMI probation and the results of this had been very positive. The full report was expected on 31 August and Mr Kitchman advised he would ensure this would be sent to the panel members. The chair also asked whether this could be added onto the agenda for the panel's next meeting for a brief discussion, which was agreed.
