1. Purpose of report

To present the main objectives of the Community Housing and Regeneration Service's business plan.

2. Recommendations

That the five main objectives of the Community Housing and Regeneration Service plan set out within the report are approved by the Cabinet Member for Housing.

3. Background

The Community Housing and Regeneration Service business plan is a corporate requirement, and sets out the Service's intentions in the medium term, 2011-14.

It contains the main objectives for the service, including strategies to achieve them, measures used to track progress, possible risks, and the resources that need to be deployed.

The objectives in the plan are all consistent with corporate priorities of regenerating the city, providing and greener and cleaner city, tackling poverty, protecting vulnerable residents, promoting equality and diversity, improving community safety, and raising standards in literacy and maths. The plan includes the delivery of the Transformation Programme as an objective, recognising the importance of the service's involvement in successfully implementing this significant change programme.

Feedback from service users, partners and the portfolio member has been taken into account in the compilation of the plan. The key sources of information on customer need and the messages from them are documented in Appendix 2.

4. Reasons for recommendations

To enable the Community Housing and Regeneration Service to implement the objectives set out in the plan.

5. Equality impact assessment (EIA)

An Equality Impact Assessment is not required for the Business Plan itself. Instead the service has rolling programme of EIAs that cover all of the major functions of the service, which are reviewed every three years.
