Update on the Review of Alcohol Related Hospital Admissions.

Activities since the last meeting.

Panel members witnessed many incidents where vulnerable people had been offered assistance by listening, informing them of services available in the city, offering 'space jackets' (for warmth) and flip-flops and ensuring that they got home safely. Additionally, numerous discarded bottles and cans were collected.

3. Street Pastors' Launch for new recruits – 20 March.

Councillors Peter Edgar and Margaret Adair attended from the Health Panel. Approximately 200 people were there including the Lord Mayor which was the best turnout so far in the three years that this has been running. There was singing of hymns, prayer, speeches (by co-ordinator, pastors and police) and an award ceremony for the new recruits. The police were very happy with the work that the Street Pastors carry out and said it has proved very effective.
