Health Overview Scrutiny Panel

- Fluoridation of Drinking Water Supplies (this issue has not yet been scrutinised as the Strategic Health Authority has yet to decide on this issue. There is currently a Judicial Review being conducted regarding the decision by Southampton City Council to fluoridate their water supply and this issue is unlikely to be dealt with whilst the Judicial Review is ongoing)
- Alcohol Related Hospital Admissions – the panel are one on nine local authorities in England who have been granted Scrutiny Development Area status by the Centre for Public Scrutiny to conduct a specific review that will help to develop a scrutiny toolkit for the benefit of other local authorities. The review must report their findings by the end of November and the review has involved a wide variety of work shadowing opportunities for the panel.
