		Portsmouth experiences the highest cycle casualties per million population outside of London and its boroughs (2011 to 2014), with the A2047 the highest cycle casualty road in the city.	Tel: 9268 8582
		During the five year period 2010 to 2014, the main 30mph road network experienced an average of 9 cycle casualties per mile. During the same period along the A2047, the number is significantly higher at 35 casualties per mile with 80% of those collisions occurring at junctions.	
		Project Deliverables	
		Green surface treatments at key junctions to maximise safe cycling practices that encourage cyclists to pick up a primary riding position. The green surfacing promotes road safety at these junctions by raising the awareness of cyclists using this route. The scheme will alter the location of the existing give-way lines at key junctions and re-instatement further back from the junction to encourage vehicles to approach the junctions more cautiously reducing risk to cyclists.	
		Due to the additional rat-run traffic via Washington Road to access Sultan Road, it is proposed that a raised table and pavement build-outs to create a pinch point are implemented. This will further reduce vehicle speeds on the approach into and out of junctions.	
		Powerscourt Road, Clydebank Road, Queens Road, are used by vehicles as rat-runs to avoid signals and congestion on the strategic road network increasing risk to vulnerable road users therefore in addition to the build-outs raised tables will be installed at these three locations.

Where a local authority arranges care and support to meet a person's needs it may charge the adult, except where the local authority is required to arrange care and support free of charge.	-
		It is proposed that the Director of Adult Social Services authorises, with the agreement of the Cabinet Member for Health & Social, an increase in these fees of 1.1% based on the December 2015 RPIY. 		Since 2012/13 an annual fee review process has been undertaken by Portsmouth City Council in consultation with the preferred suppliers of domiciliary care to review the fees paid to them. The current agreed rate for preferred suppliers of domiciliary care for 2015/16 is £13.52 per hour. It is proposed that the Director Adult Social Services with agreement from the Cabinet member for Health & Social Care authorises an increase in this rate to £14.60 per hour which will have an overall impact of approximately £511,000 to 2016/17 budgets. This is to be funded from the 2% council tax precept passed over to Adult Social Care in the approved 2016/17 budget. This increase is to address two main areas of increased cost. Firstly the impact of the National Living Wage to be introduced 1 <sup>st</sup> April 2016 and secondly to address the impact of the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) ruling that carers are to be paid for travelling time in between client visits. 			The single storey extension and the porch are both moderate in size and they would both relate appropriately to the recipient building and the wider street scene. The proposal would preserve the character and appearance of the Craneswater and Eastern Parade Conservation Area. Due to the modest size of the single storey rear extension and porch, it is not considered that the proposal would cause a significant impact in terms of increased sense of enclosure, overshadowing or loss of light. Whilst there are windows on the front elevation of the porch this would not cause overlooking or loss of privacy as the windows would occupy a hallway which is not considered to be a habitable room. The other window would occupy a WC; therefore the window would be obscure glazed. Therefore it is not considered that the proposal would cause an impact on the amenity of the surrounding occupiers.

		The latest guidance issued on 15 February 2016 states clearly that the planning process will require the 'NHS, at both the local and national level, to work in partnership across organisational boundaries and sectors'. In addition it will be essential that 'every health and care system [] come[s] together to create their own ambitious local blueprint for accelerating implementation of the Five Year Forward View (5YFV)'. The STP is seen as 'a means to build and strengthen local relationships, enabling a shared understanding of where we are now, our ambition for 2020 and the concrete steps needed to get us there'.	
		Such an ambition will be a challenge for all of our organisations, particularly in the current adverse financial climate. The STP will be a multi-year plan within the agreed footprint of Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Southampton and will have to be completed by June 2016. It will have to consider a multitude of system challenges in health and social care whilst still recognising the individual CCG's local population needs and commissioner and provider operational plans. As a result CCG lay members felt that they needed to understand this planning process and governance arrangements in much more detail.	
		CCG lay members across the area agreed to utilise one of their regular meetings in March to understand the implications of the STP and to discuss how they could assure themselves that governance structures are sound, and that the process is carried out effectively and across organisational boundaries in order to develop a joint plan with equal input from all. As this plan is going to affect all commissioners and providers of health and social care in the area we felt that it would be helpful to extend an invitation for this meeting to all non-executives of provider organisations and elected representatives of local government. We hope that you will be able to spare the time on Friday 4th March to join us in this important discussion and help us understand more fully the implications of this planning process.
