			Four letters of representation have been received from local residents objecting on the following grounds:  a) The trees are of historical importance and are included within a famous painting;  (b) Impact on visual amenity; and  (c) The tree (T11) appears to be healthy.  The application is supported by a tree report detailing survey results of 14 Lombardy Poplars situated along the eastern boundary of the University playing fields. The report highlights that 12 of the trees were in a reasonable condition and no further work was required at this stage. However, visible signs of decay were observed in T11 and T20, which increases the risk of structural failure. As a result, works are proposed to reduce the risks to T20 by reducing the crown and subsequent loading, and to completely remove and replace T19.  The Council's Arboricultural Officer highlights that the Lombary Poplars are a short lived species and the trees in this location are now reaching the end of their lives. In recent months at least two have failed through decay and collapsed, one on the University campus and one within the hospital grounds. One other within the hospital grounds has recently been identified as a failure risk and marked for removal. The evidence submitted by the applicant is considered to be reasonable and the proposed works would be appropriate. A replacement tree of a suitable species would be required through a suitably worded
