2	Charles Dickens	Former Buckland Family Centre  Proposal: that the former Buckland Family Centre in Nessus Street be appropriated into the Housing Revenue Account (HRA) for the purpose of utilising the site for the building of new homes as and when development funding is available in the HRA new build budget.  The Buckland Family Centre has been used as an operational asset by Children's Social Care to house the Family Support Team. The team is now being relocated to the civic offices and the building and site are no longer needed by Children's Social Care for operational delivery. As the site is being appropriated for the build of new social housing, Secretary of State approval is not required.  In the short term to save costs the Housing Parking and Garages team will relocate to the building in order to provide site security and basic maintenance needs. These schemes will provide much needed homes for residents and contribute to the council's Corporate Priority 6 - "Increase availability, affordability and quality of housing". The schemes will increase the overall number of homes in the HRA and will improve its viability to allow for continued maintenance and tenant services to residents. Since the application was submitted, modifications have been made to the staircase to improve its visual appearance. Whilst an external staircase is not an ideal design solution, it is considered that the modified staircase is appropriate and preserves the character and appearance of this part of the Conservation Area. The staircase is located close to windows in adjacent properties, however it is considered that any potential for overlooking would not be so significant to justify the refusal of this application.
