Q1 - What is the aim of your policy, service, function, project or strategy?

To improve parking opportunities for residents and their visitors (including carers, health visitors etc) and encourage non-residents to use Pay & Display facilities provided for longer stays, or to encourage
consideration of alternative methods of travelling to the area.

Q2 - Who is this policy, service, function, project or strategy going to benefit or have a detrimental effect on and how?

Benefit: Residents and their visitors (including friends, family, carers and health workers). Blue Badge holders are exempt from the current 2-hour time limit, and would continue to be exempt if it were changed to 1 hour. Blue Badge holders could benefit from being able to park closer to their destination more often, given a more regular turnover of vehicles vacating parking spaces.

Visitors to Old Portsmouth and those seeking free parking and walking through to the adjacent Gunwharf Quays venue would be encouraged to use the longer-stay parking provided (not in residential streets) or to consider alternative, more sustainable, modes of transport such as cycling, walking, public transport or car-sharing.
