St Jude	GROVE ROAD SOUTH AND KENT ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES 2017	Terri Crook 023 9284 1063	Following informal consultation with residents and businesses, a traffic calming scheme has been designed for Grove Road South and Kent Road.  Grove Road South is one of 10 least-compliant roads in Portsmouth in terms of vehicles adhering to the speed limit: its wide, clear nature makes it easier for drivers to reach elevated speeds. Speed data collected revealed that 49% of traffic exceeded 20mph and the 85th percentile speed is 30mph (the speed at which 85% of vehicles travel at).  There is a large school and retirement complex on Grove Road South, in addition to the residential dwellings, resulting in a high proportion of school children and other more vulnerable pedestrians in the vicinity. The road also forms a well-used direct route between the commercial areas of Elm Grove and Palmerston Road.	Formal 21-day consultation on the designed scheme, which includes - speed cushions - red coloured surfacing incorporating 20mph roundels -psychological traffic calming: red coloured surfacing with white arrows providing a 'gateway' to highlight the 20mph limit -additional 20mph roundels on the road - yellow backing boards for 20mph speed limit signs

				There have been a number of minor accidents on Kent Road, which also has direct access to local schools, and therefore the scope of the scheme was expanded to incorporate measures to address the concerns raised. The most notable concerns related to vehicles being driven at inappropriate speeds, making it more difficult to react in a timely manner if necessary.  Residents and businesses of both roads were surveyed for their views on traffic calming measures, with the majority in support of physical and psychological features being implemented in Grove Road South. The scheme design for Kent Road has been adjusted in light of the comments received, whether for or against the proposals. The replacement of physical cushions ('humps') with visual features responds to residents' feedback, aiming to highlight the 20mph speed limit and encourage lower speeds.	public consultation a full report will be presented to the Cabinet Member for Traffic &
