		What is a validation checklist for planning applications? The validation checklist sets out the level of information required by the City Council to support a planning application. The checklist comprises a list of documents and guidance that explains when each document is required. The checklist is divided into two sections which are the national validation requirements and the local validation requirements. The national requirements are set by government and are consistent across all local planning authorities in England. These are set out on the Planning Portal. The local requirements (or 'local list') must be prepared by each local planning authority and should be tailored to reflect the material planning considerations that are relevant for that area. Why is this review being undertaken?	
		The current local list was last reviewed and the subject of a consultation exercise in 2013.	
		Planning legislation requires that the local planning authority must review its local list every two years. As part of that process the Council is require to consult on a draft local list and then formally publish the document having taken any representations into consideration. A copy of the final local list must be made available on the Council's website and the list must be subsequently reviewed every two years.	
		What is the period of consultation? This consultation process adheres to the guidance on validation requirements set out by government. The City Council is inviting comments on the draft validation checklist over a period of six weeks from 9 October 2017 to 20 November 2017. Any comments received will be considered in the preparation of the final checklist before it is published on the Council's website.
