This will have no impact on other traffic as they currently have to travel around theexisting speed cushion which will remain in place. This proposal mirrors the existing cycle bypassthrough the speed cushion on the northern side of Farlington Avenue immediately north west of thisproposal. Due to the limited impact on road traffic, other than improved priority and safety for cyclists,consultation is not required unless Councillors feel it necessary to do so. 3	Hilsea	 London Road to Peronne Road Shared Route Proposal: To erect a public notice along the proposed shared route from Curtis Mead, north, to Peronne Road and to the Norway Road lights junction. Following full council agreement of the capital budget for 2017/18 on the 14th February 2017 this scheme was approved by the Cabinet Member for Traffic and Transportation on 16th March 2017. The notice will inform the public of proposals to create a new shared route for cyclists to avoid the gyratory, which is a high casualty site for cyclists, and to get any comments on the proposals. The proposals are to change the north south footway on the eastern side of London Road to shared use from Curtis Mead north, and then increase the width of the northern footway between Peronne Road and the Norway Road lights junction to make a suitable shared facility. The benefits of this proposal are to provide a safe off road alternative to the gyratory for cyclists who may wish to gain access north to Highbury College and those commuting to and from the area of the city north of the A27. The impact on existing traffic is limited as the facility will all be on the footway so will actually reduce conflict between cyclists and motorised vehicles. The proximity of the site to the city centre and the main university teaching campus would also increase opportunities to travel by foot or bicycle, reducing the dependency for car ownership. The Highways Authority confirms that with the submission of a Student Intake Management Plan to address arrivals at the start of the academic year, the proposal is unlikely to have a significant adverse impact on parking within the area. Again having regard to the lawful use of the site, it is considered that the proposal would not significantly increase activity or associated noise and disturbance at the site. The City Council's Environmental Heath Team raise no significant concerns in respect of the proposed use and the applicant has provided a Management Plan detailing how the site and its occupants would be managed to ensure minimal disruption to neighbouring occupiers. In terms of replacement windows, the proposal seeks to remove existing uPVC windows/doors and replace them with timber alternatives to match the original features.
