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2	<p>Charles Dickens</p>	<p>Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) - Neighbourhood spend to fund a crossing point on Blackfriars Road</p> <p>Proposal: that with full ward member support, the sum of £20,000 from the Charles Dickens ward neighbourhood CIL total be allocated to the provision of a crossing point on Blackfriars Road.</p> <p>The PCC Road Safety Team has been undertaking a review of crossing facilities outside Ark Ayrton primary following concerns raised by residents. Pedestrians disperse at different points across Blackfriars Rd between parked vehicles. This situation presents a high risk for child pedestrians. 3	Charles Dickens	The Portsmouth City Council (Holbrook Rd / Lake Rd Roundabout) (Mandatory Cycle Lane) (No.18) Experimental Order 2018	Nick Scott 023 9284 1637	<p>A cycle access improvement scheme is proposed to be implemented on Holbrook Road / Lake Road roundabout, in line with scheduled carriageway resurfacing works (LCR).</p> <p>The scheme will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - increase the width of the left turn cycle lanes - retro-fit infrastructure to offer segregation to cyclists - increase the size of the islands on each arm to facilitate easier access for pedestrians - increase the deflection on the roundabout to decrease the entry and exit speeds for vehicles <p>The scheme aims to achieve:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - safer cycling through segregated left hand turns and surface markings to increase awareness for cyclists and road users of required positioning - improved safety for all road users by increasing deflection on the roundabout so vehicles travel at slower speeds when entering and exiting the roundabout - reduced severity of any collision if it were to occur - limited impact on road users as the cycling improvements will not affect the available carriageway <p>The scheme will be implemented under an experimental traffic regulation order, whereby consultation takes place simultaneously with the scheme's operation for a 6-month period. During this time amendments can be made if necessary, and the 6-month consultation time reset accordingly. Public notices will be displayed in the location and on Portsmouth City Council's website, giving the public the opportunity to comment on the scheme. Statutory consultees such as the police, fire & rescue, freight haulage association, utilities companies etc. will be independently notified as per legislative requirements.</p> <p>Experimental traffic orders can be in place for up to 18 months: prior to expiry a decision should be made either to make the scheme permanent or to remove it.</p>

			<p>Planning permission was previously granted for a single-storey infill extension in March 2017. However, the extension that has been built is slightly taller than permitted. The extension is located adjacent to the boundary wall with the neighbouring property (No 12). There is a distance of approximately 4m between the extension and the side elevation of the neighbouring property. The extension faces onto a kitchen door to No 12, which is obscure glazed. The existing kitchen window to No 12 is located on its eastern elevation facing onto the rear garden, therefore, it is not considered that the proposal would result in any significant loss of light to the kitchen of No 12. The extension is also located to the north of No 12 and consequently would not result in any overshadowing. The extension does change the outlook from a first floor window on No. 12, however, however, given the 4m separation distance, is not considered that this impact would be significantly harmful to the amenities of the residents.</p> <p>Following a site visit, it was observed that the drawings accurately represent the proposal and are submitted to an appropriate scale.</p> <p>The objector also makes reference to the fact that the height of the extension is similar to a two storey extension, which was refused in April 2016 (Ref 16/00178/HOU). The refused two storey extension had a height of approximately 8.4m, which was considerably taller than the 3.9m height of the single storey extension.</p>
