The restriction aims to prevent use of the car park for long-term parking, to enable the disabled bays to be used by Blue Badge holders and to enable the space for the mobile library vehicle to be accessed. This Order will enable enforcement of the restrictions for effectiveness. Proposed conditions of use: In operation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 3 hours maximum stay (no return within 4 hours) Disabled Badge holders will be exempt from the restriction provided the Blue Badge is clearly displayed in the vehicle's windscreen. The car park also includes designated parking bays for Disabled Badge holders, the mobile library vehicle and emergency vehicles. The objection notes that the proposal to provide another vehicle entrance is sensible since the existing arrangement makes for conflicts between vehicles leaving and entering the site, as well as being confusing for pedestrians and cyclists. The objection continues on the basis that the application should be an opportunity to improve access and facilities for pedestrians and cyclists using the store. This application relates to the formation of a second vehicular access to the site and the installation of gates across it. The site comprises a recently opened Co-op convenience store, following the demolition of one of the two buildings on the site that previously operated as a DIY shop. The purpose of the application is to improve access and egress to and from the site. The Highway Officer considers that a second access would be likely to improve highways and on-site safety as it would allow delivery vehicles to travel in forward facing gear when on site and avoid reversing onto the highway or manoeuvring around in the car park, potentially causing customers cars to back up and obstruct the footpath or highway. Whilst the existing access for pedestrians and cyclists is not ideal, it is considered that this application cannot be used as a vehicle to seek the resolution to existing deficiencies. 6	13/00829/FUL Central Southsea	Kwikimart 126 Fawcett Road Southsea Alterations to shopfront to include installation of an ATM and alterations to existing roller shutter to include installation of new mullion and shutter guide	One representation has been received (from 128 Fawcett Road) raising objection on the grounds that the proposed ATM will impact upon the privacy of the occupiers of this property and result in an increase in vandalism and criminal damage to the objectors property. The application site is a two-storey corner property on the corner of Stansted Road/Fawcett Road opposite the junction with Bramble Road. The site is located outside of the designated Fawcett Road Local Centre in an area characterised by a mix of residential and commercial properties. The proposed ATM would be installed in the shopfront facing Fawcett Road. Given the location of the application site within Fawcett Road and the relatively modest design of the ATM and associated surround, this proposal is considered to be visually acceptable and of a suitable style and scale in relation to the recipient building. Furthermore, it is considered that the proposal would not result in a significant impact upon the amenities of the neighbouring occupiers in terms of loss of privacy, and is considered unlikely to give rise to any significant rise in crime or anti-social behaviour. 		Southsea Castle is a scheduled ancient monument situated in a conservation area. The works are to carefully remove the rooftop stone slabs, screed, slab and waterproof layer beneath and lay new waterproof layer with perimeter upstand and flashing details, re-screed and re-bed the stone slabs in their original locations all in accordance with Planning and English Heritage's strict requirements.	
		The contract was awarded in line with the City Council's contract procedure rules however due to this being an historic building, much altered over the years, it is a complicated structure. Upon opening up the many 'layers' of the structure to carry out the planned works additional works were found to be necessary. Much of the original stonework that was to be re-used to maintain the historic significance of the building was found to be unsuitable for re-use. This required replacement components to be purpose made, cut and carved from natural stone to the same proportions and size as the originals. Excessively inclement weather was also experienced during the contract period.	
		Accordingly it has been necessary to increase the value of the contract to £89,000.	
		There are no financial implications as these costs are still within the overall approved budget for this scheme.
