		On 21 March 2012 the Elected Member for Children and Education approved the allocation of £607,500 for the replacement boilers and heating at Wimborne Junior School as part of the School Modernisation Programme 2012/13. The total cost of the scheme was £630,000 and included a contribution of £22,500 from Wimborne Junior School. Following a detailed survey the project engineers have reported that the project could be delivered for £450,000. £140,000 from the scheme has already been allocated to another related priority scheme at Cliffdale Primary School. A further £36,500 was allocated to another related priority scheme. Tenders for the Wimborne Junior School Heating Scheme have now been received. The total costs have now been confirmed as £370,000 leaving a balance of £83,500. The school contribution is unaffected.	161. 3204 1712
		On 21 March 2012 the Cabinet Member for Education & Children approved the allocation of £90,000 in order to re-roof Manor Infant School. Detailed surveys have identified that water penetration is partly due to other roof tiles being laid at too low a pitch and consequently an alternative tiling system will be required. The estimate to complete these works to the new specification is £150,000.

Whilst the drawings do not depict the neighbouring conservatory, a site visit has been undertaken to assess the potential impact that the proposal may have on the neighbouring conservatory. The proposed conservatory would be built within the applicant's property and is of a scale and design that is considered appropriate. The proposal is of a size that would not give rise to any significant impact on amenity from loss of light or increased sense of enclosure. The issues raised regarding the neighbouring foundations and party wall are not material considerations relevant to the determination of this application. The objections are on the following grounds, (a) increased strain on the limited parking within the immediate area, (b) noise disturbance from music, dancing, vehicular movements and general activity associated with a dance school, (c) overlooking/loss of privacy and (d) loss of property value. The site is located on the west side of Haslemere Road, opposite the junction with St Ann's Road and comprises the first floor (and ground floor entrance/lobby area) of a commercial building. The first floor was previously used as a kitchen/bedroom showroom and storage area. A carpet warehouse and kitchen supplier occupy the ground floor and a commercial garage abuts the site to the north. The Development Control Engineer has advised that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant impact on the adjoining highway network. However, he does note that this area of Southsea suffers from severe parking congestion due to the high density terraced housing and the limited amount of on-street parking available. Therefore, whilst parents will be able to drop off and collect children outside the dance school (using the existing wide, dropped kerb, forecourt outside the building) they would be unlikely to park in the vicinity. The Development Control Engineer raises no objection to the application subject to conditions being imposed to ensure the proposed hours/days of operation are adhered to and that cycle provision is provided and maintained. The applicant only intends to use a basic CD stereo system or docking station for an IPod. She does not intend to use amplifying equipment. A suitable condition can be imposed to ensure this. The existing commercial use of the building generates general noise, activity and traffic movements and it is not considered, given the operational times of the proposed dance school that any additional disturbance created will be significant or indeed be at unsociable times of the day.
