		<b>Proposal:</b> that Approved Education Capital Expenditure be allocated in order to complete the replacement of the fresh water system at King Richard School.	Commissioning Manager Tel: 9284 1712
		On 14 <sup>th</sup> February 2013 the Cabinet Member for Children and Education approved the allocation of £112,204 for the replacement of the leaking felt roof at Cottage Grove Primary School as part of the School Modernisation Programme 2013/14. The total cost of the scheme was £127,000 including a contribution of £14,796 from Cottage Grove School. Following the return of tenders for this project, the project costs have been significantly reduced leaving a balance of £50,000. The school contribution is unaffected by this reduction.	
		On 21 March 2012 the Cabinet Member for Children and Education approved the allocation of £84,000 for the replacement of the fresh water system in order to ensure there was effective legionella control at King Richard School. The total cost of the scheme was £132,000 and included a contribution of £28,000 from King Richard School and £20,000 from revenue. Following the return of tenders for this project, the project costs have increased by £38,000 to a total of £170,000. The school contribution is unaffected by this increase.	
		Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £38,000 from the capital scheme at Cottage Grove to the scheme at King Richard School in order to complete the above legionella prevention works.

		<b>Proposal:</b> that disabled bays be installed for qualifying residents on the public highway, to be enforced by the city council's Civil Enforcement Officers. The aim is to allow these parking bays to be used by the intended residents and reduce the potential for their abuse by non-authorised drivers. The Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) also deletes redundant disabled bays, which can be returned to general use.	Tel: 9268 8497
		Following advertising of the above Order one letter of objection was received, however as the letter has the same reasons for objection as were made against TRO 15/2013 and was therefore considered at the Traffic & Transportation Cabinet Meeting on 20 June 2013, we do not intend treating it is an objection to this TRO. The letter objects to the principle of how PCC manages enforceable disabled bays, and not an objection to any particular bay. Legal services and the DfT do not agree with the person's objections. By not treating it as an objection we are able to install the disabled bays where needed without the delay inherent with objections. A response will be sent to the person who has written in.	
		Councillors Fazackarley, Ellcome and Patey (Cabinet Member for Traffic & Transportation and opposition spokespersons) have all agreed verbally that we should not further delay the granting (and removal) of these needed disabled bays based on Mr Sparks' previously considered correspondence and Legal Services are in agreement.

They consider the rear dormer is excessively glazed but do not object to the principle of the dormer windows. Dormers are unprecedented in Londesborough and Esslemont Road and they doubt whether sufficient headheight could be achieved. The front and side elevations of the front dormer do not correspond. 			The other letter states they have no objections at all to the proposal.	
			Notwithstanding the discrepancies within the submitted plans, the proposed part 2/part single storey extension and dormers, by reason of their design, appearance and bulk are not considered to relate satisfactorily to the recipient house and are incongruous and out of character with the area. In addition, the part 2/part single storey extension is likely to cause loss of light and outlook to the occupiers of the adjoining property to the north.
