		Background	
		Darby House was declared surplus by Cabinet on 9 February 2010 since when various residential schemes have been discussed to redevelop the site. Recently, however, a decision was made to close the adjacent office block that serves the Children's Home which permits the release of a larger site for redevelopment and will eradicate the historic issue of traffic flows and parking issues caused by the office use.	
		Since being declared surplus an outline planning application for 8 detached houses has also been approved but is subject to the provision of a small office extension to the Children's' Home, the provision of a storage shed in the rear garden and parking for additional 2 vehicles at the home. Planning approval (13/00551/FUL) was granted for this work on 24 July 2013.	
		It is proposed to proceed with the appointment of a building contractor to build the new office extension and shed and start marketing the Darby House site including for the office block site for disposal. It is therefore proposed that the Head of Corporate Assets, Business and Standards and the City Solicitor be given delegated authority to complete the sale and all other necessary legal documentation. It is further proposed that the Head of Housing Service be given delegated approval to appoint a building contract to build the office extension. The cost of the building work will not exceed £100,000. It is proposed that this work be funded from the sale of the surplus site.
