		Portsmouth City Council is looking to jointly commission a five year contract for a Child Sexual Exploitation Service.	
		The current contract is due to expire on 31 July 2014.	
		Child sexual exploitation is an issue with a high national profile. In April 2012, the Department for Education published a national Action Plan which places an expectation on Safeguarding Childrens Boards to ensure a local plan is in place. In June 2013 Portsmouth's Action Plan was finalised and one of the points raised is to commission specialist services for CSE across the area and to ensure they have sufficient capacity to provide effective service in light of the levels of need identified.	
		We are planning a joint procurement with Southampton City Council. The anticipated benefits of a joint approach are reduced overhead/admin and management costs, shared workers as children often move between the 2 cities and will benefit from the same worker and shared intelligence with Hampshire police who cover both areas. This will enhance the disruption activity of perpetrators.

4	13/00992/PLAREG Drayton & Farlington	Retrospective application for the construction of replacement detached garage, raised patio and decking, raised lawn and part screening to side boundaries to rear of property	One letter of representation has been received from the occupiers of the adjoining property to the east (No.82 First Avenue). Their objection, relating solely to the raised patio, decking and screening, can be summarised as follows: a) Loss of privacy; b) Loss of outlook; c) Accuracy of the submitted drawings; and d) Impact on property value. Impact on property value is not a material planning consideration. This application seeks retrospective permission for the construction of replacement detached garage, raised patio, decking and lawn, and screening to side boundaries. Prior to submission the applicant reduced part of the decking in height to minimise its impact on the adjoining occupiers to the east. Whilst the resulting structure is still raised above natural ground level, the stepped nature of structure limits the practical use of the patio to a single section immediately adjacent to the rear extension with is finished with full height and width folding patio doors. It is considered that with the inclusion of a condition requiring the retention of the screening to the east and western boundaries the resultant decking it not significantly harmful to the amenity of the adjoining occupiers, in terms of loss of privacy immediately to the rear of the adjoining properties to sustain a reason for refusal. In addition it is considered that the screening does not have a significant adverse impact on the amenity of the adjoining occupiers in terms of loss of light, outlook or increased sense of enclosure. It is accepted that the raised patio does offer views towards the southern extent of the adjoining gardens. However, these areas tend to be less private than those immediately adjacent to the rear of the dwelling, and are already overlooked by first and ground floor windows as a consequence of the slight gradient on the sites. 5	13/01006/FUL St Thomas	Change of use from house in multiple occupation (Class C4) to purposes falling within Class C3 (dwelling house) or Class C4 (house in multiple occupation)	One letter of representation has been received from Leasehold & Commercial Services of the City Council's Housing Service as freeholder of the building objecting to the application. The grounds of objection are; (a) noise and disruption, (b) increased foot traffic on communal walk ways and internal stairwells; (c) increased wear and tear to communal areas and properties would result in higher service charges to leaseholders and repair costs for the Housing Service, (d) greater pressure for residential parking which is already at a premium within the local area, and (e) higher levels of refuse being contained within the block and communal bin areas. This application seeks planning permission for a change of use of the property to purposes falling within Class C3 (dwelling house) or Class C4 (House in Multiple Occupation (HMO)). The interchange between Class C3 and Class C4 would normally be permitted development within the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (as amended). However, on 1st November 2011 an Article 4 Direction relating to HMOs came into force. As such, planning permission is now required in order to interchange between the uses of a Class C3 dwelling house and a Class C4 HMO where between three and six unrelated people share at least a kitchen and/or a bathroom. The property is currently in use as a Class C4 (House in Multiple Occupation (HMO)). It is generally considered that the level of activity associated with the use of any individual property as a Class C4 HMO is unlikely to be materially different to the use of a single household as a Class C3 dwelling house occupied by either a single family or other groups living as a single household. Therefore, it is considered that the proposal would not adversely affect the living conditions of the occupiers of the adjoining properties or put increased pressure on other Council departments. 7 AII	Reducing the Strength It is estimated that alcohol misuse costs the NHS, criminal justice service and employers £74 million annually in Portsmouth. A large percentage of this can be attributed to the availability of super-strength alcohol. Portsmouth also has one of the highest rates of alcohol related hospital admissions in the South East region. Action is being taken to reduce these figures and make Portsmouth a healthier and safer place to live and work. A new initiative to reduce sales of super-strength beer and cider is being rolled out locally, after having been successfully implemented in Ipswich and Weymouth. 'Reducing the Strength', the new initiative, led by Portsmouth City Council and Hampshire Constabulary, aims to encourage local off-licenses to stop selling super-strength beer or cider (anything over 6.5% in volume, excluding premium products). Local off-licences currently selling alcohol over 6.5% have been visited by representatives from the council and Hampshire Constabulary. To date, 14 shops have signed a pre-confirmation agreement, meaning they have agreed to take the alcohol off their shelves and work with the council and police to do this effectively.
