		The Building Regulations Act 2010 made new provision authorising local authorities in England and Wales to fix their own charges in a scheme, based on a full recovery of their chargeable costs, for carrying out their main building control function relating to building regulations.	
		The main aims of the 2010 Regulations was to build on the principles of devolved charge setting in order to:	
		Introduce more flexibility and enable local authorities to more accurately relate their charges to their actual costs	
		Introduce more transparency in the charging regime and improve the competitive environment	
		The Planning Service introduced Building Control charges in October 2010 following report to PRED in September 2010. Although not specifically stated in the Charges Regulations 2010 local authorities can continue to amend, revoke and replace any charging scheme they make under the Charges Regulations at any time.

cont'd	The charging schedule has now been in place for over 2 years and having reviewed the time spent on various projects together with costs it is evident that there is a need to further refine the time and costs attributed to various projects to ensure that there is total cost recovery within the fees.	
	Adjoining authorities have also revised their charging schedules and the proposed new fees are not inconsistent with revisions made by other authorities. The new charges are required to be publicised 7 days before they come into effect. Once the charges have been approved they will be publicised online via the Council website. The new fee structure will then come into force from 1 st June 2013.

4	13/00328/ PLAREG Drayton & Farlington	34 Down End Road Portsmouth Retrospective application for increase height of existing roof to allow construction of dormer windows to front and side roof slopes (resubmission of 12/00371/HOU)	A representation has been received from the occupier at No36 Down End Road raising objection on the grounds that the alterations have an overbearing impact, represent an overdevelopment of the site, and that the east and west elevations are too large and result in a loss of privacy. A comment also questions how the applicant can alter the size of the construction and submit a retrospective application to retain the changes once building work has been completed. In May 2012, an application to increase the height of the existing roof to allow the construction of dormer windows to the front and side roof slopes (including a single-storey side extension) was permitted. During construction, the height of the roof and dormers increased and consequently it became necessary to reapply, for retention of the roof alterations, to regularise the matter. Permission is sought to retain the increased roof height by 0.6m and the dormer windows to the southern, eastern and western elevations. The dormers to the east and west roof slopes are en-suite bathrooms and are obscure glazed; a safeguarding condition requiring the retention of obscure glazing prevents any overlooking issues within the adjoining gardens. Whilst the alterations have increased the height of the roof by a modest but noticeable amount, it is considered that the impact upon the amenities of the adjoining and neighbouring occupiers, have not been significantly altered. Furthermore, in terms of size/bulk and materials, the roof alterations are considered to be acceptable and relate appropriately to the existing house.
