Whilst it is acknowledged that Anchorage Road services a large number of industrial and business units, and that these play a crucial part in the economy of Portsmouth, residents' quality of life is also important. In an effort to balance these two principal needs, a timed weight restriction is being proposed.</p> <p>The timed weight restriction will help improve the quality of life for local residents. Full access for the businesses will be retained during normal working hours between Monday to Friday. A workshop for the repair of vehicles occupies the entire site, which has a two-storey scale/massing to the rear. The proposal would involve the redevelopment of the site for residential purposes with an infill terraced house being built fronting Havant Road and a two-storey building comprising two flats to the rear fronting Basin Street. Having regard to the nature of the existing industrial use and the scale of the existing building it is considered that the proposal would reduce the potential for noise and disturbance to neighbours and not have any greater impact on amenity. It is considered that the proposal is appropriate in design terms and would not appear at odds with the character of the area. Whilst the proposed redevelopment would not include any parking, regard must be had to the level of demand for parking associated with the existing use and that an additional on-street space could be provided in Havant Road following the removal of the existing dropped kerb. Having regard also to the location of the site within 100m of the Kingston Road Local Centre and proximity to a high frequency bus corridor it is considered a refusal on parking grounds could not be justified.
