An amendment to planning permission 12/00172/FUL is sought relating to the formation of an enclosed roof terrace at second floor level. In March 2012 construction of a part two-storey and part second floor rear extensions and the conversion of the uppers floors to form 6 flats was permitted. The proposed additional roof terrace would have an area of approximately 32sqm and be located to the rear of the 3-storey element of the building that fronts Connaught Road. The terrace would be set back from the edge of the building by 1.8m and surrounded by a 1.5m high masonry wall. The adjacent properties to the north are all in commercial use to the ground floor with most having residential use to the upper floors. To the west are terraced dwellings on the northern side of Connaught Road whose plots run perpendicular to those on London Road. Having regard to the relationship of the proposal to surrounding properties it is considered that the proposed roof terrace would not be likely to give rise to any significant degree of overlooking and consequently would not result in a significant loss of privacy. It is considered that the use of the roof terrace would give rise to a level of activity that would significantly affect the occupiers of neighbouring properties. 			The commercial premises west of Lower Drayton Lane have a private rear vehicular access, and the use of that access does not fall within the control of the city council. Issues in relation to rights of access and repairs, therefore, amount to private legal matters. The terrace at roof level would have a depth of 3m and incorporate privacy screens. In those circumstances the proposed terrace would not adversely affect the amenity of the adjoining or nearby occupiers. In the context of the existing terrace it is considered that the proposed extension would not amount to an unduly obtrusive feature, and in design terms it would represent an acceptable addition.
