	cont'd		One representation has been received in support, which considers the cameras are a boost to the security of the area providing an increased sense of safety and that if an offence were to be committed there is a chance it would be captured by the cameras.	
			There is no 4th camera sited by the front door. The main issues to be considered are whether the cameras are visually acceptable and would give rise to a loss of privacy. The 3 cameras at the site are considered acceptable in design terms. They are not considered to have a significant adverse impact on the amenities of the surrounding neighbours in terms of loss of privacy as the cameras overlook areas which are clearly visible from the street and from neighbouring properties front windows. Whether or not recordings and images are taken or kept is not considered material to the merits of retention of these cameras. Similarly, whether the applicants have an unjustified fear of crime, their parking habits and their relationship with their neighbours are also not material considerations. Accordingly it is considered that the proposal would not result in any significant harm to the amenity from the perception of overlooking.
