		On 21 March 2012 the Elected Member for Children and Education approved the allocation of £607,500 for the replacement boilers and heating at Wimborne Junior School as part of the School Modernisation Programme 2012/13. The total cost of the scheme was £630,000 and included a contribution of £22,500 from Wimborne Junior School. Following a detailed survey the project engineers have reported that the project can be delivered for £450,000. This does not affect the school contribution. £140,000 from this scheme has already been allocated to another related priority scheme at Cliffdale Primary School. This therefore leaves a balance of £40,000.	161. 9204 1712
		Approval is therefore sought to reallocate £20,000 from this capital scheme to another related priority scheme:	
		<b>Manor Infants School</b> – recent Asset Management Planning meetings at Manor Infants School have identified insufficient IT teaching provision and group working space. A feasibility study was undertaken which resulted in the recommendation to create two teaching spaces above existing stores within the school hall. The school will be contributing £90,000 to the project which is anticipated to be completed at a total cost of £110,000.

		<b>Proposal:</b> To advertise an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order to close Buriton Street at the junction of Crasswell Street and remove the existing one-way traffic flow within Buriton Street between Settlers Close and Crasswell Street.	Environment Tel: 9284 1312
		Representation has been received from residents via Councillor Steven Wylie, regarding the issues of stand-offs they face from opposing traffic violating the existing one-way system within Buriton Street. A traffic survey was carried out for a twelve-hour period within January 2011 to conclude how many vehicles were violating the existing one-way system. Within the twelve-hour period, 19 vehicles were observed abusing/ignoring the existing one-way system. This equates to almost one vehicle an hour rat-running through the area.	
		This scheme would seek to address the issues within the area by implementing a temporary closure of Buriton Street at its junction with Crasswell Street. It would look to improve the existing layout by impairing drivers' ability of making the illegal manoeuvre from Crasswell Street into Buriton Street. By removing the ability to violate the existing one-way system, the scheme would become self-enforcing, reducing the need for Police to enforce and educate offending drivers.	
		This proposal would stop access to through traffic travelling northbound along the northern section of Buriton Street towards Crasswell Street. Traffic wishing to access Crasswell Street would do so by utilising the existing one-way system within operation in Landport Street. The northern end of Buriton Street at the junction of Crasswell Street would be closed off to all traffic (except cycles) by implementing a temporary physical barrier. Due to the physical barrier there would be no possibility of violation by 'through' traffic. The benefit of such a proposal is that it is self-enforcing as there is no need for police to enforce a traffic order.	
		The Experimental Order could be in operation for 6 months from its installation and will contain a provision to allow the Head of Transport and Environment to modify or suspend its operation in certain specified circumstances. The consultation period will run in conjunction with the experimental order and will be reviewed during its operation.

5	12/00864/TPO  Drayton & Farlington	20 Stroudley Avenue Portsmouth Within Tree Preservation Order 92 Fell Willow tree (G1a)	Three representations have been received from the occupiers of Nos.2, 3 & 4 Marsh Close which back onto the rear garden of the applicant's property. Those residents suggest that the tree blocks sunshine and when the wind blows bits come down from the tree, it causes flies, leaf litter, blocks gutters and affects a lawn. They have also suggested that all the large trees in this area should be removed and replaced with more suitable species for the area.  The Council's Arboricultural officer has inspected the tree and has stated that it is a mature, healthy specimen which is highly visible to the public. The tree is of high amenity and landscape value. Shading may be an issue but with the correct pruning works the tree can be managed appropriately for this location. Rather than felling, which would not be justifiable in this instance, the arboricultural officer has suggested that maintenance works comprising a reduction/shortening of branches on its eastern side (nearest property) by approximately 3 metres to balance up with the remaining canopy and a crown lift to approximately 4 metres would be more appropriate.  Having regard to the Arboricultural Officer's comments it is considered that whilst it has not been properly managed the tree is nevertheless of high amenity value and to allow its felling would result in a loss of tree cover and weaken the verdant character of the area. The felling of this tree may also set a precedent in respect of similar protected trees within this location.
