The log cabin is located in the south-east corner of the garden; it is 0.2m from the eastern boundary, adjacent to No4, and within 0.6m of the southern boundary. Part of a roof support overhangs the common boundary with No4, and in this respect the applicant has confirmed that this part of the structure will be cut back to ensure there is no encroachment onto the adjoining occupier's property. In addition, the outbuilding is not considered to have any significant impact on the amenity of the adjoining occupier in terms of loss of light, outlook or privacy. The issue of drainage and run off from the roof would not warrant refusal of planning permission.
