This would create a stepping effect between the three properties. This application seeks the retention of a gazebo within the rear garden of No.4 Edenbridge Road. The gazebo is constructed of timber, with a pitched thatched roof which accommodates a domestic hot tub. The gazebo would be located within the north-east corner of the garden, within 1 m of the rear boundary, and would be separated from the boundary of the adjoining property at No.6 by 0.7m. Whilst it is recognised that the thatched roof is visible above the boundary treatment, it is not considered to have a significant impact on the amenity of the adjoining occupier in terms of light or outlook. Furthermore, the gazebo would not have an adverse impact in terms of creating a sense of enclosure. Whilst of an unusual design, it is it is considered that the structure would not amount to a visually obtrusive feature in this context, and therefore an objection would not arise on grounds of design. 		This joint board was set up to deal with the licensing of watermen. It is in effect redundant as the Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA) and the City Council can issue small boat licences now. Efforts are therefore being made to disband it, but there are legal procedures that have to be gone through to achieve the abolition of the nineteenth century Ferry Acts and twentieth century updating legislation. Therefore for the moment the board officially exists and needs to have board members elected from both councils to attend an Annual General Meeting in January of each year. 		Portsmouth City Council appoints six representatives, who must be elected members in political proportion, and Gosport Borough Council also appoints six members. The Annual Meeting appoints a Chairman and Vice-Chairman and in recent years these meetings have been held at the Civic Offices and chaired by Gosport Borough Councillor Edgar, with Councillor Hunt being appointed as Vice-Chairman. Members serve for three year terms.	
		Portsmouth's current appointees are Councillors Cheryl Buggy, Lee Hunt, David Horne, Leo Madden, Mike Blake and Gerald Vernon-Jackson. Their current period of service expires in December 2011.	
		It will be assumed that the current members are prepared to continue their service unless they inform Lin Chaplen (Customer, Community & Democratic Services) otherwise. If any other member of the council wishes to serve on this body they are asked to let Lin Chaplen know by 31 October. The appointments are expected to be made by the Cabinet Member for Environment, Councillor Eleanor Scott, at her decision meeting on 23 November. It will be for the period 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2014, subject to members remaining on the council.

The late May Bank Holiday has been put back to Monday, 4 June and there will be an additional Jubilee Bank Holiday on Tuesday, 5 June.	
		The proposed order will extend licensed hours on Friday, 1 June to 1am on Saturday, 2 June 2012 and on Saturday, 2 June to 1am on Sunday, 3 June 2012 for the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises and the provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment in licensed premises in England and Wales.
