However residents can appeal the notice issued by Southern Water, if they feel that they do not want the drains or sewers they current own to be adopted and thus lose the ownership of. 		It is felt that in the majority of cases, these appeals will occur more over the next few years, when disputes could be more prevalent, if home owners feel that the drains or sewers should have been adopted during the initial process.
