Renewal is sought for the scheme of 9 houses with parking for 9 cars, which was permitted in May 2008. The key issue is whether there has been any material change of circumstance(s) since the scheme was considered acceptable. Relevant to this site and the objection raised is parking policy following adoption of the Residential Parking Standards SPD in November 2008. Table 3 (p8) of the SPD sets out parking provision standards and requires that development with less than the expected level of parking provision will only be regarded as acceptable if accompanied by suitable evidence. The applicant's supporting information identifies that the site is within a short walking distance of high frequency bus services and is in close proximity to a range of shops and other local services in Palmerston Road. Further, it suggests the small site at 0.08ha has a well-integrated car park solution for 9 cars designed to afford a suitable quality public realm at street level, to preserve the character and appearance of the conservation area. Para 11 of the SPD also highlights other material considerations that might include "conservation area considerations, availability of alternative parking facilities or design issues including the physical constraints of the site". The provision of one space per dwelling in this sustainable location (within conservation area No2) is considered adequately justified, to meet the spirit of the guidance set out in the SPD.
