2	Charles Dickens	<p>Charlotte Street and Landport View Experimental One-Way</p> <p>Proposal: to advertise an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order to reverse the existing one-way traffic in Charlotte Street and Landport View.</p> <p>Discussions have been held with representatives of the management team at The Cascades Shopping Centre regarding the difficulties experienced when large numbers of vehicles wish to exit The Cascades car park onto Cascades Approach and Market Way. With the high volume of traffic travelling westbound on Market Way into the City from the M275, vehicles have queued across the roundabout ignoring the existing 'Keep Clear' markings, reducing the opportunities for traffic wishing to exit The Cascades car park. This, in turn, creates queues of traffic within Cascades Approach travelling north.</p> <p>The traffic flows within Cascades Approach become even more of a problem when the multi-storey car park is full. Traffic that is unable to access the car park can only be directed around the mini roundabout and north along Cascades Approach to Market Way. With little opportunity being afforded to traffic wishing to access Market Way from Cascades Approach, traffic comes to a standstill with no opportunities for traffic to exit the multi story car park. 		<p>The proposals would seek to improve traffic flows within the area for all those residents and visitors to the area. The proposed scheme would be contained within Charlotte Street and Landport View and would not affect Cascades Approach or Market Way.</p> <p>The proposal would seek to reverse the existing one-way system currently in operation along Charlotte Street and Landport View. At present, the existing one-way system is accessible from the junction of Market Way/Landport View with traffic currently travelling southbound along Landport View and westbound along Charlotte Street. If the existing system is reversed, traffic queuing southbound along Cascades Approach can be re-directed either northbound along Cascades Approach or eastbound along Charlotte Street and Landport View onto Market Way.</p> <p>The proposals are being discussed with the management at the Cascades Shopping Centre, NCP, and Mr Barry Walker with regards to consulting with local businesses. This will ensure that they are happy with the proposals and that there are no further issues they wish to be considered as part of the scheme.</p>

3	Fratton	<p>St. Mary's Churchyard – additional lighting capital scheme</p> <p>Proposal: to transfer £1,700 from revenue funding to the St Mary's churchyard additional lighting capital scheme.</p> <p>The capital scheme to provide the installation of additional lighting to St. Mary's churchyard in Fratton was approved in September 2009 and the estimated costs were £15,900. During the works, as a consequence of the layout of the historic churchyard, it was necessary to divert the original proposed route for the cabling. This necessitated the digging of additional trenches by the contractors and the installation of additional electrical supply cabling to enable all of the new lighting to be connected. The objector also alleges that the location of the trees is not accurate and asks if permission is granted that screening would be required by a condition.</p> <p>The applicant confirms that the proposed garage would be used for the parking of his car. A condition would be imposed preventing its use for any purpose other than the parking of private motor vehicles, the storage of domestic items or such other purposes ancillary to the enjoyment of the dwellinghouse. The applicant intends to keep the young tree at the front of his garden and the shrubs which provide a degree of screening, with the addition of the trees in the neighbouring garden. It is not considered appropriate or necessary to impose a condition to require the applicant to provide additional screening/boundary treatments. The objections relate to: a) the sign on elevation 2 serves no function; b) when illuminated the sign on elevation 2 is invasive and inappropriate facing a residential area; c) the height of the sign to elevation 2 is inappropriate; d) fan noise from the building is inappropriate and audible in first and second floor bedrooms.</p> <p>The advertisement to elevation 2 has already been installed and is an internally illuminated oval shaped sign positioned at first floor level on to a feature gable on the north-west elevation of the building. The advertisement faces onto the main Port Solent marina basin and whilst the rear of properties on Coverack Way do not have a direct rear to rear relationship oblique views of the advertisement would exist. The position of the proposed advertisement is considered appropriate in relation to the existing building. The representations relate to the scale of the proposal being an overdevelopment of the site resulting in loss of light to the nursery's garden and to the poor quality of the design.</p> <p>This application seeks planning permission for an alternative scheme to one granted planning permission in March 2009 for the construction of a four-storey building to form an 89 bedspace nursing home. This permission is capable of implementation and will remain valid until March 2012 and is considered to represent a strong material consideration as a fallback position. One email has also been received from a local resident commenting that the scheme would entail the loss of a pond and trees thereby threatening house sparrows and other birds.</p> <p>Whilst there are a mix of building styles fronting Solent Road the south side is primarily characterised by bungalows and there are examples of chalet bungalows in the vicinity. In this context the proposed buildings, which are set within reasonably sized plots, would complement the appearance of the street scene. The nearest bedroom windows to the proposed chalet bungalows would be some 27m south of the houses on the north side of the road and at a slightly lower level. This degree of separation would not result in a loss of amenity, and whilst the proposed buildings would decrease the views across the city and harbour the proposal would not adversely affect any recognised vista. The existing trees within the site are not of sufficient amenity value to warrant formal protection and, similarly, there would be no planning justification to require the retention of the domestic pond.
