		Following the decision taken by Full Council on 11 December 2012 the budget for the Cemeteries Service is to become cost neutral over a two year period. To make this possible additional income and savings for the two year period are required. At the Environment and Community Safety Decision Meeting on 27 February 2013 it was agreed to increase fees and charges over the two year period.	Tel: 9273 2559
		To enable the budget to be cost neutral in 2014/15 it is proposed to increase the period of Rights of Ownership on a newly purchased grave from the existing 25 years to 50 years and likewise the existing 75 years to 99 years in keeping with city cemeteries nationally. Renewal on existing rights will remain at 25 years.	
		The existing fee for 25 years is £345 which equates to £13.80 per annum. The proposal is to retain this annual equivalent fee for 50 years with a new 50 year fee at £690 which places us as one of the lowest costing Authorities when compared nationally with authorities offering similar terms. An increase to 50 year ownership is also appropriate at this point in time in relation to the remaining capacity of our cemeteries.	
		The existing fee for the 75 year option is £794. It is also proposed to set the fee for 99 years at £1,048, this equates to £10.50 per annum and again the annual pro rata fee will not be increasing.	
		The estimated additional income generated should enable the department to reach its target for the 2014/2015 financial year which is the second and final phase towards becoming cost neutral as approved.

Three letters of support have also been received. These are based on the grounds that; a) the proposed use would create jobs in the local area; b) the proposed convenience store would serve local residents; and c) the proposed use would be a valuable addition to the local area. This property is currently in use as a motorcycle sales/repairs garage. The proposed use as a convenience store (Class A1) would be appropriate within this location which is predominantly residential in character. Whilst the application site is outside of the Copnor Road (north) Local Centre, it is below the 280 square metre threshold that applies to town centre uses outside of designated centres. As such, this proposal is considered acceptable in principle. The proposed use as a convenience store would not give rise to any significant increase in traffic in this location and the proposed opening times are considered to be appropriate for this type of use. As such, the proposal is not considered likely to give rise to any significant impact on the amenities of nearby residential occupiers. Furthermore, the proposed perforated metal lathe roller shutters would be acceptable in design terms in accordance with policy PCS23 of the Portsmouth Plan. 		The Declaration includes a number of commitments for the councils taking part, including reducing smoking prevalence and health inequalities caused by smoking in the city.	
		By signing the Declaration it demonstrates the council's commitment to tackle the issues relating to tobacco control and to reduce smoking prevalence to benefit the health of our residents and the local economy.	
		Portsmouth already works effectively with local partners aiming to reduce the smoking prevalence in Portsmouth, alongside supporting national campaigns like Stoptober to engage with local residents. This work will continue to be a priority for Portsmouth.	
		This Declaration shows Portsmouth's commitment to help residents to quit smoking. Each year 80,000 people a year die from smoking related illness in England, which makes smoking the biggest cause of premature death. By signing the Declaration we are saying we are committed to protecting our local community from the harm caused by smoking.
