The main concern is that they are stored correctly in order to mitigate the risk of theft/vandalism etc. It has been stipulated in the draft letter that adequate, lockable storage must be provided on site.</p> <p>In 2004/5, the Old Portsmouth Flood Protection Scheme was constructed, which included over 20 floodgate and floodboard systems around the seaward perimeter of the area. Recent development of the Wightlink offices (now called Quay House) meant that floodgates to their perimeter wall were removed.
