A letter of objection has been received from Councillor Terry Hall (Eastney and Craneswater Ward) on the grounds of: a) overdevelopment of the site; b) development contrary to parking standards SPD; c) inappropriate refuse storage; d) inappropriate cycle storage; e) out of character with the street which is made up of houses. The conversion of a house to flats must be assessed against policy DC42. Considering that the gross floor space of the house as originally built exceeds 140sq.m. the proposed conversion is acceptable in principle. The proposal is not considered to have a significant effect on the amenity of the adjoining occupiers in terms of loss of light, outlook or privacy. The modest external alterations, to block up two windows, are considered appropriate. The proposal results in a net increase in demand for car parking of 1 space. The site is 220 metres from local shops and services on Albert Road and bus routes to and from the City Centre. The site is not capable of providing an on-site car parking space.
