		(2) In accordance with delegations to officers, the revised maximum prices for the following contracted sports and leisure facilities: Mountbatten Centre, Wimbledon Park Sports Centre, Victoria Swimming Centre, Hilsea Lido, Eastney Swimming Pool, St. Luke's Community Sports Centre, Portsmouth Gymnastics Centre, Portsmouth Indoor Tennis Centre, will be increased by the RPI(X) 5.30%.		
		Fees and charges for contracted sports and leisure facilities are reviewed annually, the last price increase being 1 st January 2008.		
		For Southsea Tennis facilities, city wide outdoor bowls facilities and Portsmouth Guildhall, the revised maximum prices will be increased by the RPI 5.00%. Proposed fees are subject to roundings.		
		For all the sports and leisure facilities, the facility operator will continue to be able to charge prices less than the maximum level, subject to market conditions.		
		Swimming prices may need to be reviewed in April 2009, in light of the Government's Free Swimming Programme for the under 16's and Over 60's, to address any anomalies.		
		Copies of the schedule of revised charges for these contracted sports and leisure facilities have been placed in the Members' Rooms. The Leisure Card will still be available for use at some of these facilities by residents on low incomes. Leisure card holders may obtain up to 40% discount on identified activities and asylum seekers may obtain a further 40% discount on presentation of an asylum seekers leisure card.

11		Adult & Family Learning Capital Project	Steve Glennon
		The Adult and Family Learning service have successfully won a bid for £30,000 of Learning and Skills Council Neighbourhood Learning in Deprived Communities funding. The bid is based on partnership working between the Portsmouth City Council Adult and Family Learning service and the PCC Community Support service team of Portsmouth City Council and two local voluntarily managed community centres (Fratton Community Association and Milton Village Community Association) and MIND. The funds will enhance 2 community facilities Fratton Community centre and Milton Village hall. This will further develop these existing premises for learning and wider community use particularly for 4 wards in the city (Fratton, Nelson and Charles Dickens and Milton) and support local voluntary and community sector organisations to develop their capacity to deliver learning opportunities for residents of disadvantaged neighbourhoods. These 4 wards are areas with pockets of deprivation some very much more profound than others. Charles Dickens and Nelson ward are well known areas of multiple deprivation, underachievement and low participation rates in learning whilst Fratton and Milton may not figure as wards with high levels of deprivation there are key characteristics of these wards which merit their inclusion. 		Milton Village Hall - Milton Village Hall is a small community centre in the heart of its community. The centre hosts a variety of groups and activities. Milton is a specific target area for improving the number of adults with level 2 and above qualifications. The centre sits within an area of educational deprivation - and is geographically uniquely placed to impact upon this. The centre has been trying to develop its programme along with Highbury College and other	

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	providers and hosts regular activities and has moved from 0% adult learning in 2005 to 7% of its programme in 2007. The centre has ambitious plans to develop its facilities and role however, the entrance and foyer are in poor condition, and the original wooden doors, while visually attractive, do not allow for easy access to the centre when it is open. The centre would like to retain the feature doors but build in a secondary set of glass sliding doors. This would make it clearly visible when the centre is 'open' to the public and make the centre more welcoming by creating an accessible and welcoming first impression. This part of our NLDC bid at Milton Village hall focuses on this improvement an enhancement to the entrance can only benefit the efforts of the centre to meet its objective of becoming a significant local learning centre. Such an improvement will encourage other providers to work in partnership with the voluntary management group.	
	Fratton Community Centre -Community Café and Drop in centre- Fratton Community Centre is a well-used centre at the heart of its local community managed by a voluntary group. Fratton sits at the hub of 3 local wards with significant deprivation; Nelson, Charles Dickens and Fratton and draws the majority if its members and users from within these communities. The centre has a good range of usage including 11% use by the BME community and hosts a wide range of groups and activities and actively supports and promotes targeted and general adult education with partner groups and local colleges. 27% of the programme at the centre in 2006 was formal or informal learning targeted at the local community. The centre currently offers 20 formal/informal learning sessions each week with approx 10-15 attending each session. The Fratton Community Centre element of the bid proposes improvements to the centre facilities in the community café and drop in centre plus room 1 and room 6. These improvements would complement existing programmes for development, enable a significant enhancement of the learning environment for existing programmes by improving classroom environments by lowering ceilings and upgrading lighting. The new computers within the cafe would not only enable the MIND service to develop its contribution including through its users to show other users how to send emails, search the net, but also enable the centre to provide access to e-learning. In addition the upgraded training rooms would enable the centre to attract further courses from the local colleges and other providers, increasing revenue and extending the curriculum available to its' very local user groups. It is anticipated that the investment from this bid at Fratton Community centre would contribute significantly not only to improved learning environments, achievement of learners and an extended curriculum but a 50% increase in learning opportunities over a two-year period. Further benefits are expected to be a saving in heating and lighting bills for t
