Although the dormer would not align directly over the 2-storey front bay, given its relatively modest size it is not considered this would amount to such an obtrusive feature to warrant refusal. A very similar dormer window was approved in 2003 and has been constructed to a property on the opposite side of the road. With the recent changes to the General Permitted Development Order the proposed rear dormer and extension can now be constructed under permitted development rights. One letter of objection has been received from the occupiers of No.18 on the grounds that the proposal will cause a significant loss of light and heat into the property and loss of outlook. 			The applicant proposes a part single-storey/part two-storey rear extension. The single storey extension projects approximately 2.3m from the rear wall of the house, in line with the existing projection. The first floor element would have a width of 2.6m, set 3.5m off the common boundary with No.16, and a hipped roof 1m higher than the eaves. The addition of the extension at ground and first floor level would be in keeping with the recipient building and would be acceptable in the context of the surrounding area. In terms of amenity the proposed single storey extension would replace an existing lean-to conservatory similar to the extension to the rear of Nos.12 and 16. In these circumstances the rear extension would not give rise to an increase sense of enclosure or loss of light. Turning to the first floor element, the additional building bulk is not considered to have an adverse effect on the amenity of the occupiers of the adjoining properties to the east or west in terms of loss of light or outlook. It is therefore considered that the scheme is capable of support.	
8	08/01572/FUL Milton	St James Hospital Locksway Road Southsea Installation of CCTV cameras to front elevation (adjacent to main entrance) and in hospital grounds	One letter of objection has been received from a nearby resident adjacent to the north-west corner of the application site on the following grounds; (a) potential for the CCTV camera to overlook the property; (b) adverse visual impact of the CCTV camera and column; and (c) desire for the CCTV column to be re-sited behind a tree. The application is for the installation of a CCTV camera to the front of the main hospital building and, a further 9 cameras, 6 of which would be mounted on new columns at various locations within the hospital grounds. The camera subject of the objection would be column-mounted and located on the corner of Langstone Way, adjacent to the common boundary wall to No.126 Mayles Road. The applicant has agreed to the installation of a screening shield to that camera to prevent the overlooking of properties in Mayles Road and Riverhead Close. This proposed shield is considered to adequately resolve potential overlooking of the adjoining residential properties. 			screened from the objector's property by the presence of a fence; it is considered that the slender profile of the column and mount, and the relatively modest dimensions of the dome mount and screen would make the camera visually acceptable in this location. The location of the camera has been chosen by the applicant to provide maximum effective coverage of the site without potential future interference from growing trees. In these circumstances the proposal is capable of support.	
9	08/01585/FUL St Thomas	63 St David's Road Southsea Hampshire Alterations to roof including construction of dormer windows to side and rear; external alterations to front elevation to include installation of external stairwell	One objection has been received from a local resident on the grounds that the development would not enhance the aesthetics of the building or the conservation area as a whole. Furthermore the windows and roof light do not appear to be of a period appearance. The three dormers proposed on the northern roof slope would each be positioned in line with the ground and first floor windows and the side entrance door. Each dormer would be modestly sized at 1.05m wide by 1.05m tall with a flat roof. It is considered this size is acceptable and would amount to three clear insertions in the roof space. The proposed rear dormer is also of a similar size to the three side dormers and is considered visually acceptable. It is not considered the dormers would significantly increase the degree to which the neighbouring properties would be overlooked. It is considered the creation of a uniformed ridge line as a result of raising the eaves and height of the roof of the rear projection would be visually acceptable given that other properties fronting Bailey's Road, including properties at the junction with St Andrew's Road to the west, have ridge lines on a single level. None of the proposed external fire escape from the basement would be visible above ground level and is therefore considered acceptable. Paulsgrove Paulsgrove Construction of detached house after demolition of existing garages Two letters received raising objection on the following grounds: a) more housing and parking should be proposed; b) insufficient off-street parking provided; d) net loss of parking; e) insufficient access for emergency vehicles; f) impact to existing access from Nos 1 and 2 Kingsland Close; f) property will overshadow garden areas; g) loss of privacy; h) loss of outlook; i) increased sense of enclosure; and j) fear of crime. There have been a number of similar redevelopments of the garage courts within the surrounding area and the principle of providing further dwellings in this residential area is considered to be appropriate. The proposed house is sited centrally within the garage court and has been positioned to maximise separation distances between properties and is not therefore considered to have a significant impact in terms of loss of light, outlook, privacy or the creation of a strong sense of enclosure. The building is proposed to be brick, timber and slate cladding with traditional pitched roofs and overall its design is considered acceptable for the location.
