It is therefore considered unreasonable to refuse this application on grounds of overshadowing.</p> <p>No concerns were originally raised in relation to the single-storey element of the extension and therefore it was not considered to necessary to re-consult neighbouring properties. 8	Charles Dickens	<p>Building Re-Naming in White Swan Road</p> <p>James Watson Halls - Unite Students are the management company for this student accommodation block, they have made an application to change the name of the block and remove the three block letters (D/N/A). In their application they make the following supporting statement:</p> <p>"Following consultation with the University of Portsmouth and current residents we have agreed to see if we can change the name of James Watson Halls after recent press coverage about James Watson's views on race."</p> <p>It is proposed to re-name the block to Rosalind Franklin Halls.</p> <p>The history behind Rosalind Franklin is as follows:</p> <p>Rosalind Elsie Franklin (25 July 1920 – 16 April 1958) was an English chemist and X-ray crystallographer whose work was central to the understanding of the molecular structures of DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid), RNA (ribonucleic acid), viruses, coal, and graphite. Although her works on coal and viruses were appreciated in her lifetime, her contributions to the discovery of the structure of DNA were largely recognised posthumously.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">/Cont'd ...</p>	<p>Malcolm Norman LLPG Custodian and SNN Officer Tel: 9284 1603</p>

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		<p>Franklin is best known for her work on the X-ray diffraction images of DNA, particularly Photo 51, while at King's College London, which led to the discovery of the DNA double helix for which James Watson, Francis Crick and Maurice Wilkins shared the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1962. Watson suggested that Franklin would have ideally been awarded a Nobel Prize in Chemistry, along with Wilkins, but, although there was not yet a rule against posthumous awards, the Nobel Committee generally does not make posthumous nominations.</p> <p>(Extract from Wikipedia.org)</p> <p>The block identifiers (D/N/A) have caused addressing difficulties in the past. The removal of these from the formal address, along with renumbering the flats using the hotel schema (floor level and flat number) will reduce delays in emergency services etc. locating the correct flat.</p> <p>The proposed renaming of the block complies with the council's Street Naming & Numbering policy.</p>
