		Funding has been awarded to PCC by the Department for Transport to deliver measures aimed at improving safety and reducing collisions along the A27 Southampton Road.	Team Tel: 9284 1312
		The A27 (Southampton Road) is a main arterial route running from Fareham into Portsmouth providing a key access route into the city. Along the route is a mix of industrial, retail, education and residential land-use with 30mph and 40mph speed limits.	
		Hampshire Constabulary collision data for the A27 during the 5 year period 2012 to 2016 demonstrates a high number of collisions (50, with 5 being serious), of which a significant number were rear end shunts (25 total with 3 being serious).	
		The A27 between its junctions with Portsdown Road in Porchester and junction 12 of the M275 in Portsmouth has been identified by the Road Safety Foundation (RSF) as being within the top ten of Britain's persistently higher risk roads (2009-11 & 2012-14).	
		This scheme would seek to improve the existing shared cycle and pedestrian facilities within the area by widening the shared footway / cycle path and removing obstructions along the route. Road side clutter/obstructions along 2km of the shared cycle path on both north and south side will be reduced/removed. Speed roundels have already been installed on the existing carriageway surface as part of the Life Cycle Replacement (LCR) resurfacing to re-affirm drivers transitioning from higher speed roads. There will be no additional changes or impact on the existing carriageway.	
		The scheme would also seek to improve the existing layout by highlighting road space to be used by other users and will look to improve the drivers' visibility of other road users within the area.

		After reviewing the local competitors, and other factors such as transport links, car parking and catering facilities, it is proposed that the best way to increase private and room hire would be to create a hire charges structure that offers a low cost booking.	
		The structure is based on three hire charge options: Standard	
		- Birthday Parties, Meetings, etc. Community and Charity	
		 Recognised community groups or charities that wish to hold events 	
		 Exceptional or Long Term Out of the ordinary booking such as memorial services or long term bookings i.e. every Monday for two months. 	
		This structure, along with the continued marketing of premium priced options for conference bookings (via third parties), will increase use of the museum and encourage engagement and continue to integrate the D-Day Story as a 'place to go' in the local community.	
		The pricing structure is designed to cover staffing costs and generate a modest profit. For example;	
		 The Briefing Room hire charge would be £20.00/hour for a standard hire during any operational day, where staff members are already on site. 	
		- The Briefing Room hire charge would be £53.00/hour for a standard hire outside any operational day, where we would require three staff members to work the out of hours hire
