WARD Drayton & Farlington	Works at Solent Infant School Proposal that Approved Education Capital Expenditure be re-allocated so that the boilers can be replaced at Solent Infant School. On 4 March 2011 the Cabinet Member for Children and Education approved the allocation of £200,000 for legionella works and fire systems at Mayfield School as part of the School Modernisation Programme 2011/12. The scheme has been completed at a total cost of £162,000. A balance of £38,000 therefore remains. The two boilers at Solent Infant School are in need of replacing. They were originally installed in 1994. 	future. The situation is further compounded by the fact that the models are no longer produced and spare parts are no longer available. It is therefore proposed that the council replaces both boilers to ensure the school can continue to operate without risk of school closure. The estimated cost is £31,000. Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £31,000 from the capital scheme at Mayfield School to the scheme at Solent Infant School in order to replace the boilers.

Permission is sought for the construction of a two-storey side extension set 0.9m off the common boundary with the rear gardens to houses fronting Mayles Road. The extension would provide a south-facing bedroom at first floor level with a 1.6m wide casement window to match the existing fenestration. The proposed window would be situated approximately 11m away from the objector's garden and offer a similar view that occurs from the existing south-facing bedroom window. The proposed extension would not, therefore, be considered to significantly increase the degree to which the Mayles Road properties are overlooked. 		We are pleased to announce that our new Director of Public Health (DPH) at Portsmouth City Council, Dr Janet Maxwell started on 2 January 2014. Janet is an experienced GP who still does clinical work. Her CV lists previous DPH roles at Bristol and West Berkshire.	Communications
		"Having trained in Southampton I was very keen to come back to the south, Portsmouth has a very strong sense of identity and history and I love that people are so proud to live here. Yet alongside this sense of pride and identity, Portsmouth has some serious health issues and deprivation. People are dying of preventable diseases and so I feel it's important for me to help encourage people to make healthier lifestyle choices by providing the support and services that they need.	
		I am keen to work with the local community as well to understand the issues they face but also to encourage them to take more responsibility for their own health. These are exciting but challenging times so we need to work closer together to address needs of the population, we can do more with less.
