1		<p><b>Cabinet Member for Culture &amp; Leisure – Decision Meeting - Monday 15 September 2008</b></p> <p>The Cabinet has made the following decisions:-</p> <p><b>Free Swimming</b></p> <p>At this meeting, which was called at less than the usual notice because of the need to make a decision by 15 September to meet the Government's deadline, the Cabinet Member for Culture &amp; Leisure, Councillor Terry Hall, decided to accept the grant for free swimming for the over 60s, and to express an interest in free swimming for the under 16s. She decided that a growth bid should be made to cover the potential costs of free swimming for the over 60s as part of the 2009/10 budget process. In the event that the growth bid is not successful, then any additional costs will be met from within the Culture &amp; Leisure cash limit and funded by equivalent savings within the portfolio. <b>2</b>	<b>Milton</b>	<p><b>1 – 4 Charlotte Terrace, Warren Avenue, Milton – Procurement of affordable Larger Homes</b></p> <p><b>Proposal:</b> that the City Council provides a grant of £150,000 towards the cost of 4 x 3 bedroom 6 person houses at the Warren Avenue housing development scheme. The tenure for 3 of the houses will be Affordable Social Rented and the final house will be made available for Low Cost Home Ownership.</p> <p>There is an identified need for affordable accommodation of 3 or more bedrooms in Portsmouth. The opportunity to procure such accommodation is rare and this grant would secure this type of larger accommodation in an area of the city where such opportunities do not often occur. The Guinness Housing Partnership has attracted £214,000 of Housing Corporation funding to this scheme and has raised over £450,000 in private finance to support the purchase of these homes. The Housing Corporation grant was maximised for the type of homes being purchased and the city council grant ensures that the purchase of the properties is financially viable.</p> <p>All of the homes contribute to the affordable housing sector in Portsmouth. As stated above, 3 of the homes will be for rent at affordable housing association levels and the tenants for the properties will be nominated by the city council.</p> <p>The Head of Financial Services has been consulted and is supportive of this expenditure. 3	Charles Dickens	<p><b>Cycle Route – Queen Street to St George’s Road - Extension</b></p> <p><b>Proposal</b> - to extend the cycle route from Queen Street, along The Hard, to join up with the route leading to the signals at St George’s Road/Park Road junction.</p> <p>Permission is sought to add the additional on road cycle lanes necessary to link the already existing facilities in Queen’s Street to the cycle lane at the Junction of St George’s Road and Park Road.</p> <p>As part of the section 278 works in Queen’s Street and under instruction from PCC the cycle lane has been continued on both sides of Queen’s Street, as far southwards as the carriageway width allows.</p> <p>All that is required is to add a section of cycle way along the Hard to begin to link these two cycle routes and complete part of the National Cycle Network Route 2.</p> <p>This work will be financed from the LTP Capital Programme allocation for measures to implement the cycling strategy at an approximate cost £5,000.</p>	<p><b>Jayne Rodgers</b>  <b>Transport and Street Management</b>  <b>Tel: 9283 4590</b></p>
4		<p><b>Cycle Parking Provision</b></p> <p><b>Proposal</b> - To install stainless steel Sheffield Stands at various locations citywide.</p> <p>The City Council receives many requests for increased cycle parking provision in the city, both generally and specifically. Permission is sought to install new and replacement cycle parking as per a schedule drawn up on the basis of observation, request, utility and need. The proposed programme has been prioritised on the basis of request and observed need.</p> <p>The locations have been assessed to ensure that the new racks will not be obstructive. Experience shows that cycle racks need to be carefully located in order to ensure usage. Prior to location, any businesses or organisations will be consulted to ensure the correct location.</p> <p>The scheme is to be financed from the LTP Capital allocation for the Implementation of the Cycling Strategy.
