		A request has been received to extend the amenity licence from 9.00am in the morning. The end time of 11.00pm Monday to Saturday and 10.30pm Sunday to remain. The reason given for the extension is to meet a need to serve morning coffee during the summer season.	
		The amenity licence was originally issued in August 1998, giving authority for tables and chairs to be placed on the highway from 11.00am to 9.30pm, Monday to Saturday and 12 noon to 9.00pm Sunday.	
		In April 2004 a revised application to extend the amenity licence hours was refused by the Executive.	
		In May 2007, a further application was received to extend the amenity licence hours from 11.00pm Monday to Saturday and 11.00am to 10.30pm Sunday. The extended hours were agreed from June 2007.	
		Since that time there have been on-going complaints from local residents regarding the problem of noise. This is being monitored by the Head of Environment and Public Protection. There are on-going tensions between some local residents and the manager of the ABAR Bistro, and if this application is successful further complaints will probably be received.	
		There are two other amenity licences in the city that allow highway trading before 9am but these are located in a pedestrian precinct. The majority of other amenity licences authorise trading from 10am or later. Considering the level of resident complaints, it is considered that 9am would be too early for this application.	
		It is therefore recommended that the application to extend the time of operation of the existing amenity licence from 11.00am to 9.00am be refused, but an alternative start time of 10.00am be offered and approved.
