The letters of objection are on the following grounds: a) pollution from garden area (smoke); b) noise and disturbance; c) security; d) loss of outlook and light; e) difficult to undertake repairs to property; and f) planting of tree would provide climbing facility to access flat roof area and create a security issue.  The letters of support make the following comments: a) good idea to keep people off of the street.  Whilst it is accepted that the removal of smokers from the street would be a benefit, this should not be at the cost of the living conditions of the neighbouring properties. The proposal would result in the removal of the existing flat roof to create an open area directly beneath the first floor lounge window of 177A, and close to that at 173A, which would be used as the external space associated with the existing public house, as extended. Bedroom windows also exist at the second floor of these residential properties. The provision of a new outside area associated with a public house is likely to give rise to significant levels of noise and disturbance directly beneath the habitable room windows of the adjacent properties, which is not considered to be acceptable. 			Planning Officer's Comments  Three letters of objection have been received from neighbouring and nearby residents. It is proposed to construct a one-and-a-half storey outbuilding at the rear of the property following the demolition of the existing garage. The proposed building would have a pitched roof, with rooflights serving a games room and shower room, and face brick elevations incorporating dentil/stringcourse features. The ground floor would comprise a garage and utility/store. In terms of design, the garage would prove to be visually acceptable in the context of the street scene and would be appropriate in relation to the house. The structure would be largely screened by the substantial boundary wall which borders the rear of the plot and the adjoining boundary to the north-west, and would not therefore amount to a visually intrusive feature.  Furthermore, the proposal would preserve the character and appearance of the Old Portsmouth Conservation Area (No4). It is	Officer Proposed
			considered that the proposed building would not have a significant impact on the amenity of the adjoining occupiers in terms of overlooking, and the window within the elevation facing St Nicholas Street could be conditioned to be obscure glazed in order to protect the amenity of the properties opposite.  The applicant has indicated that the use of the garage and games room would be ancillary to the house, which a condition could secure. Furthermore, with regard to the issues raised in respect of highway safety, the proposal would not alter the access to the highway and the garage door would not open over the highway, therefore an objection under policy DC25 would not arise.
