		The purpose of this item is to update members on action to be undertaken by the Licensing Manager following the Cabinet meeting on 2 June 2008 concerning the proposed experimental night-time restriction of vehicle access to Guildhall Walk and the associated relocation of the existing hackney carriage rank.	
		Following the Cabinet's decision to relocate the existing hackney carriage rank to White Swan Road with an additional feeder rank in Exchange Road as opposed to appointing a new stand in King Henry 1 st Street, there is no longer a requirement to publicly advertise these proposals. This is because the existing rank provision for Guildhall Walk already provides for hackney carriages to feed onto the Guildhall Walk rank from White Swan Road and Exchange Road.	
		Additionally, because the proposed Experimental Traffic Order is not a permanent change and is intended to be reviewed by the Cabinet after a monitoring period of at least 6 months and not more than 18 months, it would not be appropriate to formally revoke the Guildhall Walk taxi rank until the outcome of the review is known.	
		Therefore, subject to discussions taking place between officers and taxi trade representatives so that a workable solution can be implemented in White Swan Road together with changes in the road markings to delineate the start and finish of the rank and relocation of existing signage for the rank currently in Guildhall Walk, the relocation of the rank can proceed with immediate effect from when the Experimental Traffic Order is finalised. It is expected that the Order will be in operation with effect from 14 August 2008.

The property is a two-storey semi-detached house located on the northern side of Havant Road adjacent to the junction with Gillman Road. The ground in this area slopes upward and away from the rear garden of the application site. The applicants wish to construct a rear dormer window with a flat roof incorporating a balcony. The dormer would be some 1.2m tall and 2.2m wide situated to the western side of the roofslope adjacent to the pitch of an existing two-storey rear projection. It would be set in from the rear wall by 1.2m allowing for a balcony area with 1.2m high railings. The design of the dormer and balcony would relate appropriately to the building and to the character of the surrounding area. It is considered that the proposal would not significantly increase the degree to which the occupiers of the adjoining properties are overlooked. Although the balcony could be seen from No.104 Evelegh Road during winter months, given the distance of some 48m between the application site and the rear of the property it is not considered that an objection on the grounds of loss of privacy could be sustained. 	Police Green Paper and Police Accountability The LGA has published our own "green paper" on police accountability, ahead of the Government's Police Green Paper in mid-June. Its sets out reforms which the association believes would substantially improve the accountability of police forces in England to the local communities they serve.
