It was resolved at that meeting that the Council would dispose of the property on a 125 year lease to be preceded by a building agreement which would require the tenant to carry out an approved schedule of works and restoration over a 2 year period. An initial premium of £50,000 was to be paid upon entering the agreement and a final payment of £450,000 made upon completion. A number of delays have been experienced over the last 2 years but these have now been resolved.

The hardstanding has an adequate width to enable a car to manoeuvre into and out of the parking space, and the provision of one parking space would prove acceptable in the context of maximum parking standards. The issues of legal rights of access and alterations to the boundary wall do not fall within the remit of the local planning authority.
