With the conversion of the former convent into flats, additional residents will require parking facilities.	
		It is proposed to dissuade all-day parking by introducing Pay & Display, and therefore increase parking opportunities for residents and visitors.

Outline planning permission has been granted establishing the principle of a replacement school in this location. There is a significant open area on the north side of Allaway Avenue and opposite the school, and the curved school building would primarily set back from the road edge. The school building is sited a minimum of 45 metres from the closest residential property and does not propose any classrooms, and only limited external playing areas on the north side of the building. As such the proposal would not result in a detrimental impact on the privacy of the occupants of the school or the residential properties. The proposal is for a replacement school and therefore although the location of traffic movements may alter from Jubilee Avenue to the west, the access points are as approved under the outline application and are considered acceptable. 2	(Cont'd)		Any impact on parking would be for short periods of time for dropping off and collecting of children and this would not be considered to result in a significant and detrimental impact on the neighbouring residential properties. Although the proposal includes the loss of trees, those on the boundary of the railway are to be retained and a landscape master plan has been submitted which indicates an enhancement of the variety of planting within the area. An area of habitat planting within the school grounds is also proposed. It is inevitable that some disturbance will occur during the development, however this would be for a limited period of time and an objection to the proposal on this ground could not be sustained.
