15		Consultation by Portsmouth City Council on the proposed changes to the application and validation requirements for planning applications Members will be aware that the Government is changing the way in which all types of planning and related applications are to be submitted. This change involves the mandatory use of the new National Standard 1APP Form(s). Most of the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Local Planning Authorities have worked together under the auspices of the Hampshire and Isle Of Wight Planning Officers Group (HIPOG) to respond to these changes in a collaborative manner to make it easier for those who work throughout the County to see what it is proposed will be required by each individual authority. From 6th April 2008, the National Standard Planning Application Form(s) will become the only method of submitting a planning application for most types of planning and related consents (except for Minerals applications and Building Control applications) to Portsmouth City Council. The standard form(s) is intended to make the process of submitting planning and related applications less confusing as it will replace the variety of forms currently produced by LPAs which differ in terms of the questions asked, the style and layout of the form, the supporting information required and the number of copies of the forms and drawings to be provided. From 6th April 2008 it will be mandatory for planning and related applications to include all of the information and documents specified on the form (the national requirements) together with the additional information and documents specified by the Local Planning Authority to whom the application is made (the local requirements). Final guidance on the Validation Of Planning Applications explaining the new forms and how they fit into the overall planning process has recently been produced by the Department of Communities and Local Government and a circular will be issued in due course.
