1. Purpose of report

Following the recent changes in Group Strengths on the Council there is a consequent need under the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, to review the allocation of committee seats to the political groups and non-aligned members.

2. Recommendations

2.1 That Council

- (a) determine the allocation of seats on committees and Panels based on the information set out below and having regard to any inter group agreements that may be achieved prior to the meeting, and
- (b) ratify consequent named membership changes proposed by the respective Group Leaders at the meeting.

3. Supporting background Information and implications

Set out below are the implications of the change in Group Strengths on the Council. The figures in brackets indicate the original position where this is different to the revised position. Some of the implications may appear perverse, in that one political group may lose membership but it may be other political parties that lose seats. This is because the law requires that the majority party retains a majority on all committees and panels that are required to be politically proportional in accordance with the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 - Section 15 (5b)

"That the majority of seats on the body (committees) is allocated to a particular group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the Authority's membership".

Thus, the Liberal Democrat Group will hold approximately five seats above their strict mathematical entitlement as they have a majority of seats upon the Council and thus are required by the Regulations to have a majority on each politically balanced committee/panel on the Council.



Group Leaders will need to advise the changes in membership required to meet their new committee allocations.
