2	Eastney & Craneswater Milton	The Portsmouth City Council (Owen Street and Ward Road) (Amendments to Residents' Parking Places: MG Zone) (No.48) Order 2021	Nikki Musson 023 9283 4461 Contact for more details and plan	A new Traffic Regulation Order is proposed to address concerns raised by some residents living on the north side of Highland Road, on the boundary of the MH and MG parking zones, in properties that have no off-street parking and double yellow lines to the front.  A number of residents of Highland Road have contacted ward councillors and the Council to request access to some of the bays opposite their properties, in Ward Road and Owen Street. Changing the boundaries of a parking zone is a major undertaking, and instead, a successful alternative solution has been to provide shared parking bays in some roads. This means designated bays can be used by permit holders of adjoining parking zones (MG and MH), and this Order relates to approximately 12 spaces.  In addition to usual consultation measures (publishing proposals in the <i>Portsmouth News</i> , on PCC's website and displaying yellow notices on lampposts), we are currently also writing to affected properties regarding traffic and parking proposals to raise awareness and provide an opportunity to comment, as many people continue to limit their travel and/or work from home.	To undertake statutory 21-day public consultation on the proposals detailed opposite; anticipated to start later in June.  The response to the consultation will help to determine whether or not to implement the proposals.  Any objections received during the consultation will require a report to the T&T Cabinet Member, for a decision to be made at a public meeting, as per statutory process.

			In terms of the impact on the living conditions of the adjoining occupiers, it is considered that the level of activity that could be associated with the use of any individual property as a dwellinghouse (Class C3) which involves occupation by a single family, would be unlikely to be significantly different than the occupation of the property by between 3 and 6 unrelated persons as a house in multiple occupation. 				Policy PCS20 of the Portsmouth Plan states that applications for the change of use to a HMO will only be permitted where the community is not already imbalanced by a concentration of such uses, or where the development would not create an imbalance. The adopted Houses in Multiple Occupation SPD (October 2019), sets out how Policy PCS20 will be implemented and details how the City Council will apply this policy to all planning applications for HMO uses. The SPD states that a community will be considered to be imbalanced where more than 10% of residential properties within the area surrounding the application site (within a 50m radius) are already in HMO use.	
				Based on information held by the City Council, of the 60 properties within a 50 metre radius of the application site, one property has been identified as an existing HMO in lawful use. Therefore, the existing number of HMOs equates to 1.66% of the properties within the search area. The addition of the application property would result in 3.33% of properties being an HMO within the 50m radius, thus falling within the 10% threshold limit above which an area is considered to be imbalanced.

			Given that there is not an over-concentration of HMOs within the surrounding area, it is considered that the impact of one further HMO would not be significantly harmful. Having regard to this material consideration, it is considered that there would not be a significant impact on residential amenity or community balance from the proposal.
