The Council has agreed with Housing 21 that the period of time identified in a nominations agreement that the Council has at first sale for the shared ownership properties should be extended to twelve weeks so that there is more time available to identify and nominate appropriate candidates in terms of care, support and housing need. In addition to the loss of the existing use other objections relate to (a) parking, (b) that the development will result in a student ghetto, (c) that it will affect landlords who rely on student lets; (d) there is already sufficient student accommodation in the area; (e) unsuitable for student accommodation adjacent to arterial route; (f) disruption through building work; and (g) building should be listed.  The Council as local planning authority would be unable to prevent the closure of the premises and subsequent loss of the existing public house/music venue use. The proposal would need to be considered on its individual merits.  The site is located within the University Quarter identified in the City Centre Master Plan and its use to provide student accommodation would be considered acceptable in principle. Given its location within an area of high accessibility to public transport and other services, a car-free development to provide student occupation would be justified. The applicant has engaged with the University to ensure that an appropriate standard of accommodation is provided internally, which includes a satisfactory level of communal area, laundry facilities and cycle storage.  The proposed alterations at roof level are comparatively modest and are considered to relate satisfactorily to the recipient building. Subject to the completion of a legal agreement restricting occupation of the building as a halls of residence and providing appropriate mitigation against recreational disturbance on protected areas, the proposals are considered capable of support. The proposed extension would have a depth of 2.1 metres where it would abut the common boundary with the objector's property and would be screened by a shed in objector's garden. Having regard to the limited scale of the extension it is considered that the proposal would have no significant effect on the living conditions of the occupiers of the adjoining property. The submitted drawings are to a recognised scale and as such do not need to be dimensioned. The accuracy of the location of a drain on the drawings would not be material to the determination of this application. The City Council will purchase the cycle and in effect lease it back to the employee through a salary sacrifice agreement. The cost will then be recovered by reducing the gross salary/councillor allowances over a period of 12 months.
